PASTOR'S PEN DECEMBER 2018

I blinked and its Christmas Again!!! Where did all the year go? The older I get the more I understand the scripture that says, "But do not forget this one thing, dear friends: With the Lord a day is like a thousand years, and a thousand years are like a day." 2 Peter 3:8 Time either seems to drag on and on or speed by in the blink of an eye. Didn't we just do the "Walk to Bethlehem" and here it is again, this week! And what happened to Thanksgiving?!!

Part of Advent is a study in the passage of time. The prophecy in Isaiah 40 of John the Baptist was made about 700 years before John the Baptist began his preaching. John the Baptist was the "one crying in the wilderness prepare the way for the Lord; make straight in the desert a highway for our God." John began his ministry about 30 years after the baby Jesus lay in the cradle of hay. We await a final word on the cost as the plans are finalized and we continue to raise funds. In the meantime, during Advent, we will join together in worship and small group study as I preach, and others teach on "Because of Bethlehem" a sermon series and a study by Max Lucado. The 8pm is "Carols, Candles and Communion" a very beautiful and traditional Christmas eve service.

Building Committee Report



Activities

The Building Committee met on Tuesday 9 November at 3pm in Ed's and discussed the following;

John Nyman of Concord discussed the activities leading up to our scheduled ground breaking.

Pastor Fred recommended moving the scheduled ground-breaking date from 1 May to 13 May due to Easter being on 21 April 2019

Pastor Fred suggested that moving the nursery to the patio rooms should be scheduled as one of the last items of this project to enable maximizing Patio Room use for meetings during construction

Tim Smith of Swaim discussed the impact of our 16 October plenary design session on the architectural drawings and presented the updates

We discussed the three courses of action to address the Church-wide storage issue

Build a 3,000 sqft storage shed at an estimated cost of \$150K

Repurpose the 2,880 sqft Admin Bldg at an estimated cost of \$40K

Take no action because of cost constraints

The District Superintendent noted that the Book of Discipline (Section VI. Local Church Property, pages 717-741) requires that three separate Church Conferences be held to approve any new building activities

Funding

Sharon Scanlan, the Finance Committee Chair, is now the Church's primary point of contact for any potential Building Committee loan sourcing. The Building Committee Chair the secondary point of contact

Approximately \$1M of the estimated \$1.8M needed has already been successfully pledged for Phase 1 – no change

The initial funding estimates have not increased and there have been no substantial requirement changes or additional costs incurred – no change

Approximately 50% of the congregation's households have already pledged an average of approximately \$8110 each to the New Vistas Capitol Campaign which means that approximately 50% of the congregation's households have not yet joined the effort and pledged to the New Vistas Capitol Campaign

DECEMBER 2018 Finance

In October, our income was under budget by -\$6,146 and expenses were under budget by -\$2,442. The net fund increase was +\$1,416, which was -\$5,120 under budget. Year-to-date we are behind budgeted income by -\$8,650. However, we had \$21,200 in prepaid pledges last December so we should be on budget by year-end.

Our 2019 Stewardship campaign wrapped up on Sunday, November 11 with a wonderful Celebration Luncheon. Our co-chairs, Benith and Craig MacPherson have a separate article in Echoes about the campaign, but the Finance Team would like to thank them for doing another fabulous job in planning a great campaign that was very well organized, executed and successful!

We thank you all so very much, for the wonderful support you have given to our various Mission ministries this past year and look forward to what God has for us to do this next year 2019.

As I promised last month, I want to give you a report on our Celebration of Learning Trip to our sister church Fuente de Vida in Agua Prieta, Mexico. We ended up with 40 of us on the bus and after a short delay we were on our way to the border. We made a quick stop off I 10 to pick up Pastor Fred & Valerie on the southeast side of town, and then on to Douglas and into the line of vehicles to cross the border into Mexico. Everyone was given a job assignment on the bus and introduced to the leaders of each team. We had a bit of a wait at the border but eventually we were on our way to the Colonia with Pasto Gela aboard to guide the way. The day was just lovely, no rain like last year, cool weather and a nice crowd to meet us. After unloading our supplies we were ushered into the Community Center full of folks waiting for us. In short order we got set up and on with the program. After a greeting, we called by name all the sponsors with us to come forward and greet their student and get their picture taken. Once again I had the joy of translating Pastor Fred's words as he gave a short talk on the benefits of an education to the students their families. This was followed by a delightful dance by a group of girls in bright orange costumes for our enjoyment. Then it was time to give out 47 Certificates of Achievement to the students who had a B+ or better average in their last school year. Each mother was called forward with her awarded child and presented with a lovely bag of goodies full of all your donations, as well as a name tag with their name and child's name on it. One mother had 3 names on her tag and several had 2. After receiving the Certificate, a picture was taken with the mother, students and Pastor Fred. It is very important to honor these parents and encourage them to keep their children in school. So many of these parents did not get to finish grade school, so the gift bag is a small but important show of our appreciation for their efforts in keep their kids in school and help them to achieve an education and ultimately a better future. Following the ceremony we were treated to a delicious lunch prepared by the women's co-op. The next event was art & craft projects and then on to the games. We had 9 games going at one time and the kids ran from one to the next collecting their tickets and rushing to the prize room to get a prize and then rush back to play again. What a fun day!! We stopped when the prizes ran out. The ladies of the church had laid out all the prizes on shelves and tables wall to wall in the old prefab trailer that had been their church building. It is truly on it's "last leg" but still provides classroom space for Christian education.

Two new classrooms are under construction on the grounds and they will be welcome for sure!! By 2:30 PM we were ready to go. Brian Cowman, our great photographer, took our group picture and we were on the bus and back to the border crossing. Very smooth crossing and after inspection by the customs officers, we were back in the bus and on our way home. We had a great time on the return trip sharing our experiences of the day. I was so glad we had 3 of our youth with us Kiana Hernandez, Karime Penuelos & Cialyn Floyd as well as 10 first timers. We arrived back to Vista near 6:00 PM and were greeted by a lovely sunset at the end of another great trip to our sister church. Thanking God for a great day of sharing with our partners in faith in Agua Prieta, Mexico.




