Our new Administration and Education building is on schedule for completion by Wednesday 18 December and we are on budget. The building has a roof, including seven heating, ventilation, air conditioning units. The exterior walls have been wrapped in weather-proof material, insulated and two coats of man-made stucco have been applied. The overwhelming majority of interior ductwork and interior insulation has been installed and the electrical, plumbing and low voltage wiring is over 90% complete. As many of you saw with your own eyes during the walking tour on Sunday 27 October – progress is tangible and we are excited. The Building Committee is very thankful for the encouragement, love, prayers, good will and support from the Congregation helping us make your dreams come true. The next tour is scheduled for Sunday 24 November – we hope to see you all there.

August Year-to-Date 2019 Financial Results

We have had a very good year. Year-to-date income exceeds the budget by \$6,143 and expenses are under budget by \$12,182. Net income for the General Fund is \$51,745 YTD, which is ahead of budget and last year. Maintaining these trends are very important since we have begun making interest payments on the construction loan and upon completion of the building we will begin mortgage payments of \$35.000 annually.

Special thanks to those of you who use ACH or credit card payments because it has made a big difference in steady monthly income in the summer months instead of a big dip! If you aren't using an automatic monthly payment for your pledge, please consider it! Contact Dennis Kimmel to set up your account.

Attendance for August represented a **10.4%** increase, **not** including San Manuel attendance of 75! Additionally, we had 265 view our service on Live Streaming, which is an average of 66 weekly.

The 4 Building Fund CD's with CIT, TIAA and UMCU that will mature in October and we have begun the process to move the funds to the bank for construction payments.

Our committee will resume meetings in September when we begin our 2020 Stewardship and Budgeting processes.

We returned from Agua Prieta, Mexico yesterday evening with a heart full of joy and another memorable experience to cherish. 34 of us traveled to Aqua Prieta on our comfortable touring bus. We had 6 new folks with us who got to see our mission ministry in Agua Prieta for the 1st time. So many improvements have been made since my 1st trip to the Colonia almost 17 years ago. The new Christian Education building is completed and we were able to use both rooms, one for prizes for the games, and one for the craft projects. 36 students received certificates of achievement along with a \$15.00 gift certificate to a local store. 21 Mothers, 2 Grandmothers, and 2 Fathers received gift bags along with the recognition of their children receiving their certificates for their good grades this past school year. The smiles on their faces and the pride that showed in their eyes were a gift to see. One of the young girls recited a lovely poem she had written, entitled Gratitude, in appreciation for our help to the students. Reciting a poem, written just for the occasion, is one of the lovely customs of the culture in Mexico. We received a warm welcome from Pastor Gela. Pastor Fred gave an inspiring talk to both the students and the parents. The Sponsors from Vista were introduced, and at lunch prepared by the Women's Co-op, they shared the table with their sponsored student. I got to have lunch with my student, Anneth Tamayo, a 9th grader, and her Mother and Brother. All around the room you could see our Vista folks sitting with their special kids and what a joy to watch the smiles and hear the laughter. Following the lunch the fun began with games in the dusty street and crafts in the new Ed building. One of my favorite sights was seeing Dan Boring at the end of a rope, in a tug a war with some little boys pulling with their entire mite, trying to pull Dan across the line. I have a HUNCH Dan let them win and after getting their winning tickets, they were off to the prize room to select one of the great prizes that was waiting for them, and what a prize room it was, with a dozen tables covered with the items you all sent down for them. There are so many people to thank for the culmination of the annual Celebration of Learning Festival. Only God knows how many of you dropped off items in the mission basket for these great kids and their parents. Thank you so much for all you good people at Vista that support this Ministry. This event is the high light of the year for these kids and their parents, and because of you, we are able to make it happen every year.

There are a few super folks that led the teams and made it so special for everyone. I first want to thank Jane Lundsten who drove me around on a number of trips to buy all the supplies and helped us pack up all the items and also made all the clothing for the 6 bare dolls that were donated. Wow what a transformation Jane made!!

I also want to thank Jan Hopke-Almer and her team who worked in the prize room. Jan heads up our education program and she has spent countless hours shopping and then putting together little prize bags for the Festival and then leading all the operation of the prize room.

A big thank you goes to Valerie Hammons and her team for all the games the kids enjoyed.
