Pastor's Pen January 6, 2021

Dear Members and Friends of Vista Church,

One year ago, this month, we were moving into and planning our grand opening of our new Education and Administration building with great plans for how it was going to be used for Children, Youth and Adult Sunday School classes. It was going to be the place for our choir to practice and great fellowship events to take place. Two months later on March 16th all the dreams for this new building and the ministries and missions it would house were put on hold. We're still holding,... and still hanging on. It reminds me of the famous old Methodist hymn sung at every Annual Conference for over 200 years, "And Are We Yet Alive!" Yes, we are alive and strong and ready to take on all the challenges and opportunities of a New Year through the power and presence of the Spirit of Christ.

Though the building is built, the Building Program is not over. We still must remodel the Patio Room into the nursery. This project was put on hold due to hail damage that became a long-protracted odyssey dealing with insurance companies etc. Most of the hail damage has been repaired in time to get the Nursery Remodeling going this month, but we have waited, and waited, and waited. God gives me verses to guide my life a day, or year, or longer at a time. I had wondered why he gave me the word, "Wait on the Lord" as 2020 began. Now I know. 2020 has been a year of extreme waiting for the vaccines to come, the pandemic, quarantining, and social distancing to end. It has been a hard year in the political arena.

Vista Church in 2020 lost 18 members to death (they went home to their reward; their mission being completed). We had 13 members move, withdraw and transfer. But we brought in 3 preparatory members (children) and 16 adults. Many of those who went were great financial supporters, so that as 2020 ended well, 2021 is a challenge. As our Financial Chairperson says, "This is a year of needs, not wants when it comes to spending."

But the year coming up is also a year of great opportunity. Our church has opened to live in-person worship under strict guidelines. Our Livestreaming has touched thousands of lives with the Good News of Jesus Christ. I am not sure how to evaluate the statistics but up to March 16th we averaged 50 on Boxcast after that it jumped up to over 200 per Sunday. Our Facebook averages 50 to 100 views a Sunday and we are also seen on Fire TV, Roku and have been working on YouTube. Our Livestream worshippers are from all over the United States and we have some regular ones in Mexico, the Caribbean, and Switzerland. Occasionally someone joins us from Africa and the UK. Our Livestream Team has done a remarkable job of a high-quality production that invites us into the presence of God and while there we are in each other's presence. Thanks Paul, Pam, Bill, Clark, Nancy, and Teresa! Thanks to the brave people (musicians, liturgists etc.) who Sunday after Sunday have gathered to make sure we can worship together despite the lethality of this disease.

Yes, we have learned a lot in 2020 and 2021 will be a great year as we are released from this plague, and in each other's presence we will give praise to God and together sing (without masks:) "And Are We Yet Alive!"

SNAK PAK ECHOES ARTICLE JANUARY 2021

There has been a lot to celebrate about the Snak Pak program this past fall semester.

Ordering the food from Amazon and having them deliver it directly to Coronado K-8 School has worked very well.

In addition to the \$4,500 provided by Vista, Santa Catalina is providing \$7,500 this school year, an increase of \$2,000. This has been a huge help given the increase in the cost of food during this pandemic and that our churches do not have the buying power of the Community Food Bank of Southern Arizona, which previously ordered the food for the program.

The social worker at Coronado, Connie Ammon, has been wonderful. Since no volunteers are allowed at school, she has been assembling the packs herself on Wednesday. (Coronado is currently on a hybrid learning schedule: Half the student body comes to school on Monday and Thursday, half on Tuesday and Friday. There are no students at school on Wednesday). The 60 students eligible for the program receive their pack at the end of the school day on Thursday or Friday.

We hope that our funds will stretch to occasionally add extra items to the Snak Pak for this school year, which normally includes 13 items:

One Chef Boyardee ravioli cup or one macaroni and cheese cup.

One packet of Starkist tuna salad and crackers or one Starkist chicken salad packet

Three Quaker fruit and cream instant oatmeal packets

Two Quaker chewy chocolate chip granola bars One Dole cherry mixed fruit cup in juice **or** one cup of Dole diced peaches.

Two bags Goldfish crackers

Three Nutrigrain fruit and cereal bars.

January 2021 Echoes Finance Committee Article

November income was \$1,787 over budget and expenses were -\$1,741 under budget. We budgeted a -\$5,472 General Fund Net Income but it was -\$3,241 after our mortgage payment.

YTD expenses are -\$12,277 under budget but +\$49,500 more than 2019. \$22,410 of the increase is in interest payments on the mortgage. The balance is in staff expense, plant expense and increased apportionments. The principal has been reduced to \$533,438 from \$550,000. We hope to be under \$530,000 by year-end.

Live Streaming attendance in November was 983. In person attendance was 262. Facebook attendance cannot be tracked.

SBA Payroll Protection Program (PPP)

Great news and a wonderful early Christmas present! December 17 we were notified by Canyon Community Bank that our Payroll Protection Loan Forgiveness application was approved by the SBA!

2021 Financial Budget

The Finance Committee met on December 15 and approved a balanced budget to recommend to the Church Council, who approved it the same day.

Income:

2021 - \$453, 350 2020 Budget - \$476,400 2020 Est. - \$486,831

2021 pledges are currently \$410,101. Pledges are budgeted as 91% of General Offering Income. 9% is Unpledged General Offering Income. 2020 pledge income is 85% of General Offering Income.

Expenses:

2021 - \$443,138 2020 Budget - \$455,075 2020 Est. - \$446,149

Net Income After Expenses and Before Principal Payments:

2021 - \$10,212 2020 Budget - \$21,325 2020 Est. - \$40,682

Net Income After Expenses and After Principal Payments:

2021 - \$212 2020 Budget - \$10,025 2020 Est. - \$23,323

We feel this is a conservative income budget and realistic expense budget. Our history is to come in under our expense budgets and achieve our income budgets.

We want thank Benith and Craig MacPherson for chairing the campaign for the 4th time and doing such a wonderful job! Also, thanks to the committee and the speakers. It was a successful campaign in a very difficult year for Vista UMC.
