Your Endowment Fund

The numbers are in for 2020 and the Endowment Committee is pleased to announce that our fund delivered an 18.34% return for the year. The return is net of contributions, distributions, and expenses. Based on the average of the returns for the past 3 years, the Endowment Committee will be able to provide \$15,500.00 in 2021 to support special projects, consistent with our charter. This represents the largest amount that Endowment has ever made available.


ACH – Automated Clearing House

Mission Outreach Ministry

As we enter this month of Valentines day, our thoughts go to those we love and to those who have expressed their love for us. A few days ago I received a letter sent to us from Pastor Gela, who pastors our sister church Fuente de Vida in Agua Prieta Mexico. I have translated it into English so you can read her words to us:

(Please reference pastor Gela's letter beginning on the next page)

With great joy, we held our 1st in person Mission Committee meeting (observing all the CDC rules) this past month. What a treat it was to see so many of our team leaders and Mission partners after a 10 month absence. We studied a list of each of our Mission projects and their current needs and made decisions on what assistance we want to provide right now. Here is a report of what we are supplying this month.

- 1) Fuente de Vida Church: \$1000.00 for food, utilities and needs of families who are laid off from work due to the pandemic. \$500.00 for needs connected to the Covid 19 virus ie: meds, sanitizing products, etc. \$500.00 for internet connection for schooling for our students. Cost is \$25.00 per month for a connection to the government schooling program on the internet.
- 2) Impact: \$555.00 for the Food Bank for food needs in our community. We have received a great response to the Warm Winter program this past Dec & Jan. Next month we will give you a full account of what you have donated.
- 3) Family 1st: \$1000.00 for assistance with utilities and operating cost in both offices in Oracle & Winkelman, as well as funds for baby diapers. We will be checking out cost for adult diapers as there is a great need for them too, as they are quite costly.
- 4) Sister Jose Homeless Women's Center: We welcome Gene & Diane Bywater as our new team leaders for this project. We allocated \$300.00 for purchases of a meal in a can with pop top lids ie: Spaghettios, Chile, etc. Many women live on the streets and these types of meals can be eaten without cooking facilities. We also allotted \$1000.00 for shopping carts that the women can use to hold their limited possessions. We are looking into a sturdier product that will have a longer street life.
- 5) Esperanza en Escalante housing for our military veterans and families: \$500.00 for cleaning and hygiene, items. Here are some facts that we need to know:

50,000 veterans are homeless on any given night.10% of the homeless veterans are women, 23% of the total homeless population are veterans, 25% have used homeless services. 33% of the male homeless is made up of veterans, 47% are Veterans of the Vietnam War era. 76% experience substance abuse, mental & physical health problems. 85% completed high school/GED, compared to 59% of non-veteran homeless. This is an eye opener for us all!!

I want to extend a special thanks to Jan Hopke Almer for her fine work in applying 2 grants from Thrivent and receiving them for assistance for one of our new Mission projects the Emerge Center against Domestic Violence. With these resources she was able to supply 30 backpacks full of school supplies to Emerge for this last fall semester. Well done Jan!!

As you can see, we continue to reach out to our community and beyond to serve those who are in need. This would not be possible without your generous help. Your love and generosity supplied \$4505.00 thru the Christmas offering this year.

Letter from Pastor Gela 1-14-21

Dear Beloved Sister Dee and Vista Church:

I want to comment to you on a number of projects going on at our church. The children are now in their "new normal", virtual classes from their homes and as we have been discussing, they need support to receive their lessons by internet and by what we have heard on the news, this school year, will be one of only studies in their homes.

We give God the glory as He has sustained us during this contagion. We have 2 young people who were ultimately infected with the virus, as well as 3 adults but they moved forward with treatment and did not experience any grave symptoms.

I also want to tell you that we had "The month of the King" in December celebrated by a dinner for the homeless people, as we have done now for several years. We did it downtown at the coffee roasting shop. We served the meals out the window. We also gave out food plates, a blanket and a personal cleaning kits and also knitted cap and hats and gloves. It was a good blessing to them, but also for us, as we were able to carry this out in the middle of this active pandemic.

I also want to tell you, that we are moving forward with the construction of the cement patio that is being laid where the old portable church buildings once stood. We are putting up the fencing along the east and west sides of the property, and we have the baptismal already finished. This is really a fabulous project, and I think it will be a place where we can come together with no problems, as it is an open air cement patio floor. We hope that in the summer we will have it completed, as God permits. A number of the older students have been cooperating and helping with the project, and are using their time off from their studies to help with the construction.

Our Sunday services and bible studies at the church continue by virtual airing. Within a few weeks we will initiate a study of discipleship for new people, as now we are transmitting thru Facebook. We have added a number of new people and they need to be discipled.

I want to thank you for your support that you continue to offer the students, even though we were not able to have the Celebration of Learning Festival, you sent us the Certificates of Achievement and gift certificates to the students as well as the mothers. A million thanks for the support you gave these young people. We miss you very much, not being able to see you all and spend time with you and we miss not being able to sit down and share a lunch, the games, and the crafts. The truth is, we miss you because you are in our hearts and we are "sister churches" with the widest extension of that word.

I give thanks to God for the Fuente de Vida church, that in spite of not being together for 11 months, they have been faithful in our daily prayer groups and have very active prayer times all 24 hours of the day, 7 days a week and I remain in constant communication with the church, thanks to God.

I send you a greeting and a strong embrace to your Pastor Fred and to every one of our brothers and sister of the Vista de la Montana Church. You are in our hearts and my desire is that in this New Year, our Lord will free us of this illness, and that we can see each other with an embrace. May all that you do be blessed and prosperous from our Eternal Father.

February 2021 Echoes Finance Committee Article

December 2020 income was \$10,273 over budget and expenses were \$2,328 over budget. General Fund Net Income was \$5,844 over budget after our mortgage principal payment.

December 2020 YTD expenses are -\$9,982 under budget but +\$40,127 more than 2019. \$30,995 of the increase is in interest payments on the mortgage. The balance is in increased staff expense and apportionments. YTD income was \$26,003 over budget,

The mortgage principal has been reduced to \$530,837 from \$550,000.

The Payroll Protection Plan grant of \$44,739 was forgiven in December and we will owe NO payments or interest. We do not qualify for the new round of PPP grants since the church/no-profit has to have had a quarter with a -25% decrease in revenue from 2019 and we did not.

A Zoom Finance Orientation meeting for new committee members was held on Jan. 27.
