Pastor's Pen March 2021

“When the days drew near for him to be taken up, he set his face to go to Jerusalem.” Luke 9:51

As I write this Ash Wednesday and the season Lent are approaching. This is the time in the Christian year in terms of the scriptures and preaching we turn our faces to Jerusalem and the Cross. In all 3 of the Synoptic Gospels the story of the Transfiguration is the pivot at which time Jesus turns from teaching and healing to his destiny on the Cross as the expiation for all the sin of all humankind.

March is a similar pivot time in terms of time and weather. In March of every year we have the “Vernal Equinox”, which is the day halfway between the winter and summer solstice. The importance of this for Christians is that the date of Easter is figured as the first Sunday, after the first full moon after the Vernal Equinox”. Most of the time it seems Easter is in March or early April like this year. We pivot then from the sufferings and sacrifice of Jesus towards his teaching of how to live his abundant life here on earth. Indeed March is a time of pivoting.

In terms of weather, it is said of March, “It comes in as a lion and goes out as a lamb”. In this part of Arizona what this means is that we enter March with mild weather and exit it in a low bake headed for the scorching heat of summer. Many times, in my life though the first two weeks of March it has seemed to rain. I hope that is the case this year.

As I write this, another great pivot I believe is about to start. Eleven months ago, we shut down in-person worship. It was only in November we began to open up in a limited way. But as I write this, I know of 30+ members of our congregation who have been vaccinated. This coming weekend dozens more will be. By the end of March and April? Who knows how many, but maybe most who want the vaccine. This means we will be pivoting to fully opening. It will be a great day for us of celebration, but also remembrance of the losses we have suffered personally, as a church and as a nation. It will be a bittersweet time of celebration as we remember the loss and celebrate the future God has in store for us together.

With all of that being said, keep healthy, keep hopeful, and keep within your heart the words of St. Paul who himself suffered so much for the Gospel.

Mortgage Challenge Update

Recently you received a letter from me outlining a Lenten Challenge. A faithful and generous member has given a \$38,000 gift to pay down our mortgage principal with the challenge that our congregation match her amazing gift! We are truly blessed to have such a wonderful new meeting place and office space. Soon we will be able to again meet in person and share fellowship, Christian Education and meetings in person in our new building.

We have already received gifts from a member's IRA Required Minimum Distribution. Another donated their entire first stimulus check. We are receiving checks daily to help us reach our goal of \$38,000 from the congregation. We hope you can help us achieve this goal during Lent as your Lenten sacrifice during one of the most critical years in our church family's history. If we match the \$38,000 gift this year, our generous donor will make the same commitment every year for another four years!

We will announce our progress weekly during Lent. As we go to press, our original mortgage principal was \$550,000 and we will owe \$472,521, ending February. Every dollar makes a difference! We have received \$17,146 in matching gifts in February!!

Vista Church has sustained and comforted our members through the pandemic with our wonderful live streamed services, outreach to our members and continued mission projects in our community and with our sister church in Agua Prieta, Mexico. Vista Church "has a heart" and it has never been more evident than during the past year.

Your Endowment Fund

The numbers are in for 2020 and the Endowment Committee is pleased to announce that our fund delivered an 18.34% return for the year. The return is net of contributions, distributions, and expenses. Based on the average of the returns for the past 3 years, the Endowment Committee will be able to provide \$15,500.00 in 2021 to support special projects, consistent with our charter. This represents the largest amount that Endowment has ever made available.

The text is available from Upper Room, Cokesbury, Amazon, Christian Book, and others.


The Upper Room is offering an on-line Lenten Retreat. You can find more information at the link below.

Meanwhile stay well - and happy.



He is in charge of all contributions for the Church. You can complete your general pledge or building pledge through a stock gift, which may provide a tax incentive if you donate appreciated stock.

The Ease of Credit Card and Automatic Bank Giving

You can give to the Church using your credit card for a one-time gift, or set up an automated donation on a one-time, weekly or monthly schedule. To donate, go to our Vista UMC website <http://vistaumc.org/> and on the bottom of the Home page there is a link to our Donation Page. It's safe, secure and easy to use. ACH – Automated Clearing House

IRA Gift from your Required Minimum Distribution (RMD)

Retirees ages 70 ½ or older can transfer money *tax free* directly from their IRA to a charity such as Vista UMC and it can count towards your RMD (Required Minimum Distribution). It is important to consult your Financial Adviser to set this up properly.

March 2021 Echoes Finance Committee Article

January 2021 income was \$2,602 over budget and expenses were \$2,945 under budget. General Fund Net Income was \$5,547 over budget after our mortgage principal payment.

We have received an additional 6 pledges for 2021 and our new total is \$417,781 vs. \$447,851 in 2020.

The Finance Committee approved a revised Finance Operations Manual.

Attendance was 260 in person, 1,396 on Live Streaming and approximately 300 on Facebook for a total of over 1900!! That is almost 400 a week.

March 2021 Echoes Mission Outreach Ministry

March is here and with it comes the Spring, but it has been a rough winter for many. Because of your generosity we have been able to help some of those in need in our community.

I spoke to Pastor Gela, the pastor of our **Sister Church in Agua Prieta Mexico**, this past week. All are ok, but very concerned that the vaccine is so hard to get, as Mexico does not produce it, so they are trying to get it from a number of countries around the world. No idea when they will get it in Agua Prieta. The other concern is that, under President Biden's administration, the rules regarding the asylum seekers at the US border will change bringing thousands of people to Agua Prieta again, as in 2019, in an attempt to cross the border. Most of these people are very poor and do not have the resources to self-sustain, thus creating a huge burden on the people of Agua Prieta. For years now, their church has helped feed refugees who camp on the sidewalk at the crossing, so as not to lose their spot in line, hoping their names will be called to have their case heard by the US officials. The kitchen in their Community Center has been the source of all the meal preparation by the **Women's Coop**. They, in the past, were supplied all the food materials by the generosity of the congregation, but many are out of work so there is concern about the food cost of this ministry. The **Cement Slab project**, where the portables buildings were before, is going well. The older students are taking work turns every day AM & PM, with 4-hour work shifts, as a way to repay their scholarships. We have sponsored 8 High School Students & 6 University and Tech school Students this semester. We also sent financial assistance for the internet cost, for the online schooling at all grade levels.

We sent **Impact in Catalina**, a check for \$550.00 this past month to the **Food Bank** and got a thank you from them. 380 Families receive food boxes each week. We make this collection on the 1st Sunday of each month for those in our Catalina community area that need our help, especially at this time when so many have lost their jobs. Our **Warm Winter program** provided the **Clothing Bank**, 489 Women's items, 190 items for men, and 27 bedding items for a total of 706 items. Team leader Benith MacPherson did a great job of collecting, recording and delivering these to the Clothing Bank. Giff Tompkins, noted at the Clothing Bank, the bedding items are 1st to go. Next year we will emphasis bedding.

Family 1st received 900 diapers from the good shopping of Team leader Jan Hopke Almer, as well as 60 adult diapers that are in much need. We also sent \$1000 to assist in the support of this ministry.

The Creative Hands team, with the good work of 3 ladies, led by Jan Bohe, has created 115 clothing items for children in the last 4 months that went to between Family 1st and Impact's clothing bank. This is an amazing amount of work for only 3 people. They could sure use more helpful hands. Give Team leader Jan Bohe a call if you can help at 520-825-9725.

Sister Jose Homeless Women's Center, Gene & Diane Bywater, our Team leaders, went shopping with \$300.00 for pop top canned meals to be given out at the Center. We are looking into sturdier carts for the ladies, but the supply is low right now. Here is some data for the year 2020 that shows what a well used facility Sister Jose is: Day Guests 16,582, Breakfasts 10,326, Lunchs 14,985, Showers 6,163, Laundry 3,489, Overnights 5,374, Hot meals 13,291, Daytime rest 1,912, Light suppers 502.

Esperanza en Escalante is a home for homeless and poor US Military Vets and families. Paul Arnett our Team leader, went shopping with the manager, and we supplied a number of household goods that the vets need in their homes such as cleaning supplies, paper goods, etc. These are the requested type of supplies needed at this time. Paul also supplied a new American flag that has flown over the Capitol in Washington DC. They are finishing the construction of 50 new 1, 2, & 3, bedroom houses, which are being occupied. This facility borders Davis Monthan AFB.

We had a great Mission Committee meeting on the 10th of February with 13 members in attendance. We voted to use the Easter offering to help our various Mission Ministries with assistance in the fight against this COVID 19 pandemic. The need is great and we thank you in advance for your care and love for those in need. Next Mission meeting is Wed, March 10th at 1:00 PM in the Elizabeth Room. We will be following all the CDC rules. You are welcome to join us. We thank you for your support which allows us, to show the Face of Christ to our community and beyond.


