Based on the average of the returns for the past 3 years, the Endowment Committee will be able to provide \$15,500.00 in 2021 to support special projects, consistent with our charter. This represents the largest amount that Endowment has ever made available.

## Echoes April 2021 Mission Outreach Ministry

Happy Easter to everyone! What a joy it is to, once again celebrate the resurrection of our Lord and Savior, as we work in our Mission program at Vista to show the loving face of God to our community and beyond. There are no words sufficient enough, to thank you for your support for our Mission Ministry across this past year that has seen so much suffering and loss. As we see the community opening up to some semblance of "normal" we still have a lot of work to do to assist with the remnant of this Covid virus. We are dedicating this year's Easter offering to the needs of our various mission projects that have experienced the heavy burden of this pandemic. Let me share just a few of them with you.

Our sister church Fuente de Vida in Agua Prieta, Mexico, has still not seen, at this writing, any antivirus vaccinations in their city. Mexico is just now purchasing the vaccine from the available supply in Europe and with, the now anticipated overflow of vaccine product in the USA, they may be able to assist in providing a supply for the Mexican community. Two of the 3 hospitals of the city have been solely dedicated to treating the many Covid patients at no charge, but all meds received by the patients must be repaid. This is a heavy burden for the many newly unemployed and sick due to the pandemic. The masses that are accumulating at our border crossings, and many now ill, is an added burden to the border cities like Agua Prieta. The additional burden to our church community is the utility expenses that must be repaid, and the monthly cost just keeps on accumulating.

**Impact in Catalina** continues to see the numbers growing of people seeking food for their families in higher numbers each week. Impact continues to deliver food to the seniors, the sick and the shut-ins.

**Sister Jose Homeless Women's Shelter** is seeing women seeking help in larger numbers than ever before. We have committed to assist with the plexiglass partitions between the sleeping cots to protect from contamination.

The Snak Pak program is carried on by one of the members of the Coronado School staff, by home delivering up to 45 food bags a week to the homes of children who have been listed due to food and nutritional shortages.

Please see the article by Jan Hopke Almer, of the needs of **Emerge Center** for families fleeing abuse and mistreatment. When they flee their homes, most leave with only the clothes on their backs. During this past year many homes have been sadly affected as a result of the pressures of this pandemic.

As you can see, this pandemic has had a big impact on those I have listed and so many more. We thank God that we can be of some assistance to those who need our help, and we are only able to do that, because of you and your continued support. We thank you for your trust in your Mission Team as we continue to help those who God has placed in our pathway to serve.

The Mission team meets on the 2<sup>nd</sup> Wed. of each month in the Elizabeth room, and we are following all the CDC rules.

**February 2021** income was \$1,078 over budget and expenses were \$1,949 under budget. General Fund Net Income was \$3,027 over budget after our mortgage principal payment.

Attendance was 216 in person, 814 on Live Streaming and approximately 250 on Facebook for a total of over 1280!!

Our mortgage principal, with our Lenten Challenge, was reduced to \$469,277 at

the end of March! We have paid off over \$80,000 in 10 months!! March ending mortgage principal will be under \$445



## The Miracle Rummage Sale!

Once again, the good members of Vista pulled off a stunning event: our rummage sale. The location proved to be highly effective in keeping the sale from interfering with church activities, especially Sunday. We were up the hill by the sheds. We advertised Friday at 9 AM. Next time it will be 7**am!** No other option unless it is 6:30AM. Our first customer arrived at 6:40. By 7 we had a crowd and by 7:15 there was a throng, which continued to 1PM with brisk sales.

So, if anyone wants to know why we opened early. Never shut the door on a crowd of people waving 20\$ bills! A table saw as our biggest ticket item at 260\$. This was a wonderful tool, sold by Sears back when Sears sold pride of the shop tools. Another really good item was a double refrigerator. We were given an electric personal scooter and sold it on the first day! Every sale is different. This sale, furniture was a slow sell, especially sofas. We were blessed with tools this time. We had every kind of tool, a mountain of pliers, screw drivers and wire cutters. ALL sold by noon first day. All power tools, gone on Friday.

We unloaded boxes and sold these assorted items as fast as we priced them. By noon Saturday we cut prices and Sunday morning we were half off. We were also out of resupply. All the sheds were empty, and we were taking down tables. This is proof that the sale is a success! I never thought we would see empty sheds but let me tell you all our sheds including the one at U haul are bare. This was filled with an estate we were blessed with.

Remember this, as we were setting up on Tuesday morning it was 39 degrees and spitting snow. The situation was bleak, approaching dire. The ominous dark sky was threatening. Hey, we had advertising out and commitments made!! Wednesday was better, Thursday was fair, and **Friday was a blessing from Heaven.** The weekend weather was splendid. **This was the Miracle Rummage Sale.** 

The crowd was sick of sitting home and the wonderful days brought them out to spend money, & enjoy themselves. Vista has a 20-year reputation of the best rummage sales. This is my 6<sup>th</sup> Vista sale. We have top stuff at fair prices. Many people say, we wait for your sale or when will you have another? The UMM keeps the bar high! I thank all the good Vista members who helped, several ladies were on site for half of all open hours and many hours pre and post. UMM members were always present. I also thank the donors; many items were top stuff!

Next time, someone should do donuts and coffee for sale. Maybe soup and sandwiches. Make a buck. Probably make \$500 after expenses. Some things never sell like electronics, computers, area rugs, pressed wood furniture, hide a beds, books, and clothing. We had about 600lb of books and only got \$20 for the lot so no more of these in the future.

This was a miracle sale. We had splendid weather. Remember a line from Henry V; blessed be God and not our part for it. Amen. So many variables went our way no one can take credit. We received a large estate as a gift last

September. We had no storage then. The estate paid the rent of a 10 X 15 storage room at U haul. That we were to pay rent beginning next month, is in part a reason for this date of sale.

A highly noticeable player in this event was Pete Rice, He very patiently drew attention by the highway with flags and banners through the entire sale. Thank you, Pete! I cannot name all the players, if I tried, I would miss someone. So, let me thank EVERYONE who participated in any form! Our net was \$9,910!!! The whole thing was so blessed.
