## Significance of Memorial Day

Memorial Day, formally known as Decoration Day, is a federal holiday observed yearly on the last Monday of May. Memorial Day is a day that commemorates all men and women who have died while serving in the military for the United States of America.

### **History of Memorial Day**

The history of Memorial Day dates back to the American Civil War. It started as an event to honor soldiers who had died during the war. It is said to be inspired by the way people in the Southern states honored the dead. The original national celebration of Decoration Day took place on 30 May 1868. There was over twenty four cities and towns across the United States that claim to be the birthplace of Memorial Day. Waterloo (New York) was officially declared the birthplace of Memorial Day by President Lyndon Johnson in May 1966. In the late 19th century, the holiday (previously known as Decoration Day) became known as Memorial Day and was expanded to include the deceased veterans of all the wars fought by American forces. Originally, the holiday used to be celebrated on May 30, regardless of the day of the week that it fell on. In 1968, the Uniform Holidays Bill was passed and as a result the day changed.

### **Traditions of Memorial Day**

Traditionally Memorial Day is viewed as a time of honor and remembrance. Throughout the United States it is common to visit cemeteries, particularly military ones, and decorate graves of the deceased with flowers, small flags and wreathes. Other common traditions of Memorial Day 2021 that are still practiced today include the raising the U.S. flag quickly to the tops of flagpoles, slowly lowered to half-mast, and then it is raised again to full height at noon. The lowering of the flag at half-mast is meant to honor the fallen soldiers who have died for their country over the years. While re-raising the flag is meant to symbolize the resolve of the living to carry on the fight for freedom so that the nation's heroes will not have died in vain. On the United States Capitol Building's West Lawn, a Memorial Day concert is held annually and is broadcasted live around the country. Additionally, there are thousands of Memorial Day 2021 parades all across the country in cities small and large. Many will wear or put on a display of red poppies on this day as a symbol of fallen soldiers. This tradition grew out of the famous poem by Canadian John McCrae known as 'In Flander's Fields', where Moina Michael conceived an idea to wear red poppies on Memorial day in honor of those who died serving the nation during war.




Join us in wearing **RED** to church on Sunday May 23rd

# May 2021 Finance Committee

**March 2021** income was \$1,506 over budget and expenses were \$1,901 under budget. General Fund Net Income was \$2,994 over budget after our mortgage principal payment. YTD Vista is \$5,147 ahead of the income budget and -\$9,551 under the expanse budget. Expenses are less than last year. We begin our lower income months as we go into the second quarter. Expenses basically are the same every month.

April ending mortgage principal will be approximately \$420,000, which is a reduction of \$130,000 in a year, largely due to the success of the Lenten Challenge and our incredibly generous gift of \$38,000 from our anonymous donor.

### **Mission Outreach Ministry**

With great joy and appreciation to our wonderful Vista Family, I am happy to report that to date we have received \$6,949.00 from the **Easter offering**. Thank you so much for your generosity will go to help so many people in our community and beyond. May God be praised!!

This past Saturday we said goodbye to our treasured member **Dr. Jane Stump**. She was the leader of the **Memory Choir** that was such a blessing to so many. What a remarkable person she was and what an amazing life she lived, touching and blessing so many with her skills and knowledge. We are hoping and praying that God will give us another leader to carry on her good work into the future.

I had a wonderful conversation this past week with **Pastor Gela** of our sister church **Fuente de Vida in Agua Prieta Mexico.** She sends her love and gratitude for all of our help during this ongoing pandemic. Just 2 weeks ago they began to get the antivirus vaccine in Agua Prieta. The Mexican Army is giving all the shots and they started with the 60+ people and next week it will be the 50+ for a few weeks and then on down the age range till the whole city is vaccinated.

The funds that we sent them for the meds needed to treat patients with the virus, has truly been a life saver and she credits us with saving a number of lives with our support for meds as they are not freely supplied in the hospitals. They are renewing "in person" church services with only 50 at a time. They will begin 2 services of 50 people each next Sunday. The funds we sent to help pay for internet studies for all High School Students as well as University and Tech School has been a huge blessing, so that these students can continue their studies on the internet during this pandemic. The cost to receive this service is \$25.00 a month and for these poor people, that is a huge amount. With your help, we have been able to send the funds needed for them to continue their studies in spite of this pandemic. We are looking into getting some tablets or laptops so that it would be much easier for them to do their school work and learning from a larger screen than just the small screen of a cell phone. If you have any of this equipment that is not in use, we will be happy to pick it up and help these students with their education.

The older students have been busy in their after study time, planting a garden around the new open air slab where they will be worshiping soon in the open air, located where the old trailers were once parked. This will allow them to meet in larger numbers in the open air. At this time Americans with passports can freely come and go into Mexico, but the Mexican people cannot enter the US even though they have their current Visas. We sure do look forward to the day when this Border Issue is solved and life can return to normal!!

We were able to send \$1500.00 to the **Impact Food Bank in Catalina.** We received a nice letter of thanks from Barbara McClure the director. She informs us that Impact, formally Catalina Community Services, is celebrating their 20<sup>th</sup> anniversary and shared some amazing information of what has transpired over these 20 years, \$10,850,000.00 of food distribution, 604,929 clothing items to the community, 169,082 food deliveries and senior meals given, as well as numerous other services to the community. She says that because of people like us, this was all able to take place and has provided hope when there was no hope. Thank you Vista Family for being part of this good work in our community. Creative Hands continues to make clothing for Family First and the Impact Clothing Bank and this Easter Season they delivered some lovely Easter Clothing for children to choose from. Our thanks go to Team Leader Jan Bohe and her helpers. We sure could use some more helpers to sew. Please call Jan at 825-9725 for further info. Also thank to Jan Hopke Almer for a big delivery of much needed diapers to Family 1st. We can always use more. And you can drop them off in the Mission baskets in the Narthex.

I want to thank **Kathy Campbell** for all the years of great work that she has given in leading our **Snak Pak Program** at Coronado K-8 school, she is retiring from the job, moving to a new home and is turning the work over to a shared partnership with Vista's Mission program, Coronado School, and the Catholic Mission who have been our partners in this work for some time now. Our Diane Coleman will be working with Mariallyn Ocziak from the Catholic Mission in ordering the food for the Snak Paks from Amazon that will be delivered to Connie, the School Social worker at Coronado School. Connie will see to the packaging and delivery to the selected students. We were able to meet with all these great folks at our last Mission meeting and work out all these details. Our thanks go to our new Team Leader Diane Coleman for the gift of volunteering her service to this project.

As many of you know, every **Memorial Day** we at Vista, remember and honor those in our Military who have made the ultimate sacrifice for our freedoms, by supporting the **Hearts Apart program at Davis Monthan AFB**. This program supports the families of deployed troops as well as wounded warriors and military families who have members with special needs. Each month a special program and outing is planned for them, but since this pandemic has hit, they have had to revise the program. They do this by doing drive by grab and go meals and providing arts and crafts bags for the children. Although they can't host them in a one center venue, they still ensure that they know we are here supporting them. At this time they do full meals and bags with activities, that averages about \$1000-\$1200 per event with venues and activities changing each month. I have been in touch with MSgt. Sergio Lopez at the Family Center on the DM Base who says "we sure do appreciate any support you are able to provide us and we Thank You so much". You may make your checks out to Vista and write D. M. Heart's Apart in the memo and show your appreciation for our military families. We will make our final collection on Sunday May 30<sup>th</sup>.

We received a thank you letter from **Sister Jose Homeless Women's Center** thanking us for the \$500.00 we sent to buy the plastic shields needed during this pandemic to separate the cots. Jean Fedigan the director writes to us "Your donation will have a transforming impact on the lives of the women we serve, contributions like yours go to ensure we can provide necessities for women in need. At sister Jose Center it is our mission to ensure the safety and dignity of homeless women in the Tucson Area. The scope of our work is wide, but with the support of compassionate community members like you, we are able to provide in 2021 to date, approximately 22,000 meals, 4000 showers, 750 quiet rests and access to medical services.
