#### **EMERGE UMW & Mission Outreach Project & Ladies Brunch**

The EMERGE Center Against Domestic Abuse in Tucson was the focus of this mission project. We received a \$250 grant from Thrivent used to purchase 25 complete sets of personal hygiene supplies for EMERGE. Thrivent is a nonprofit personal finance company that provides two Action Team Grants (up to \$250 + \$250 per year) to their members for Action Team community service projects. Thanks to the very generous contributions of Vista church members, participants at this event put together 53 personal hygiene gift bags with items requested by EMERGE including shampoo, conditioner, body wash, bar soap, lotion, deodorant, chap stick, toothpaste and a tooth brush. Also added to each bag were facemasks, hand sanitizer and a stationary gift bag including a prayer card and a business card stating "A Gift From Vista United Methodist Church" with the church's address and phone number and a bible verse.

EMERGE also requested wish list items of new towels, wash clothes and twin size sheets. In addition to the 53 gift bags, Vista Church members donated 50 sets of towels (2 bath towels, two hand towels and two wash clothes), extra wash clothes and 11 sets of twin size sheets. These donations filled three vehicles and were

delivered to the EMERGE Center Against Domestic Abuse at 2545 E Adams Street in Tucson after the event on Wednesday, May 19<sup>th</sup>. The EMERGE staff were overwhelmed with the generosity and number of donations generated by this UMW & Mission Outreach & Thrivent Action Team Project. Thank you to the ladies and other Vista church members that shared their generosity and time to put these donations together for EMERGE!




## Vista Remembrance Garden

## **Leaving Your Legacy Through A Bequest**

A popular way to leave a lasting legacy to your faith is to establish a bequest. A bequest is a gift from your estate—a transfer of cash, securities, or other property. You can make a gift to the Vista Permanent Endowment Fund by including language in your will or living trust dedicating a specific amount or percentage to the Fund. By including the PEF in your will, your investment will help Vista church keep the gospel message alive and growing.

#### **Types of Bequest**

**Specific bequest:** One of the many ways to support the PEF through your will or trust, and the easiest, is a bequest of a fixed dollar amount or specific property. If you would like your charitable gifts to remain in proportion to other bequests, you can designate a specific percentage of your estate, rather than a fixed amount, be given to the PEF.

**Residuary bequest:** If you do not wish to specify the exact size or nature of your charitable provision (often the size of a future estate is difficult to estimate), you might consider naming the PEF as a residual beneficiary of your estate. You may provide that all or a portion of the remainder of your estate shall pass to the PEF after other commitments have been fulfilled.

You can give to the Church using your credit card for a one-time gift, or set up an automated donation on a one-time, weekly or monthly schedule. To donate, go to our Vista UMC website http://vistaumc.org/ and on\_the bottom of the Home page there is a link to our **Donation Page**. It's safe, secure and easy to use. Not only can you give to the Church, but you can collect miles or points from your credit card! If you have any questions, please call Valerie Hammons, Pastoral Assistant.

#### TACH – Automated Clearing House

Many of our members give through ACH – Automated Clearing House, which is a monthly direct deposit to the Church from your checking account. *If you would like to do this, please contact Dennis Kimmel, Financial Secretary.* 

#### TIRA Gift from your Required Minimum Distribution (RMD)

Retirees ages 70 ½ or older can transfer money *tax free* directly from their IRA to a charity such as Vista UMC and it can count towards your RMD (Required Minimum Distribution). It is important to consult your Financial Adviser to set this up properly.

## Finance Committee

**April 2021** income was \$2,005 under budget and expenses were \$1,041 under budget. General Fund Net Income was \$1,377 under budget after our mortgage principal payment. YTD Vista is \$3,052 ahead of the income budget and \$9,295 under the expanse budget. Expenses are less than last year. We have entered our lower income summer months when expenses exceed income.

At the April Finance meeting we approved making an additional payment of \$20,000 on the mortgage principal. April ending mortgage principal was \$419,680, which is a reduction of \$130,000 in a year, largely due to the success of the Lenten Challenge and our incredibly generous gift of \$38,000 from our anonymous donor.





### **Aqua Prieta School Supplies Mission Project**

Mark your Calendar: Sunday June 6<sup>th</sup> will be the start of the AP School Supplies Mission Project. We had hoped to be able to have our usual wonderful cake and beverages to celebrate, but Covid again has kept us from sharing food. However, please know that your generosity is greatly appreciated, and you will hear more about this wonderful project that morning.

Last summer Vista church members provided school supplies and backpacks for 151 children including university students at our sister church Fuente de Vida (Fountain of Life). The School Supplies Mission Project is part of our Mission Committee's Economic Development Program in Aqua Prieta (AP), Mexico.

A donation of \$25 per student buys the long list of school supplies and backpacks required for students to attend the public schools.

Letters were sent in May to past student sponsors giving them an opportunity to keep their same student(s) for the 2021-2022 school year. After the letters are received, if you would like to continue sponsoring your student(s) make your check out to **Vista UMC with AP School Supplies** in the memo line **no later than June 20<sup>th</sup>.** If your student is no longer at Fuente de Vida you will be given the opportunity to choose a different student. Our goal is to complete fundraising for school supplies no later than July 12th. After that date, Jan Hopke-Almer, Benith Mac-Pherson and Dee Berman will focus on purchasing new school supplies and organizing their delivery to the students at Fuente de Vida Church. Thank you for your generous support of these needy students and families from our sister church.

Medicine for those in our sister church in Agua Prieta, Mexico who have suffered from Covid, cleaning supplies, masks, hygiene products, clothing and so much more. ## **100 YEARS YOUNG**Jeanne Farnum

Vista was honored to be a part of Jeanne Farnum's 100<sup>th</sup> birthday celebration on Sunday, May 9<sup>th</sup>. Members of her family attended with her, followed on Tuesday, May 11<sup>th</sup> for a great celebration with all six of her children, twelve of her grand-children and three great grandchildren. In addition, many of her close friends came over to wish her a happy birthday, creating a memorable occasion for Jeanne!

How well do you know that person sitting near you on Sundays? At 100 years old, I wanted to know what Jeanne has accomplished and asked her daughter, Joanie Rooker (also a Vista member). She sent the following: Jeanne Seaman Farnum was born in

Houghton, Michigan on May 11, 1921. She was involved in dance, music, drama, skiing and ice skating as she grew up there. She graduated from Illinois University with a degree in Geology and was the first woman to be a part of the Michigan Geological Survey and the first woman assistant curator of the AE Seaman Geological Museum which is named after her grandfather. She joined the Red Cross in WWII and was sent to Italy, while her fiancé, Larry Farnum, was stationed in Australia. They joined again in January 1947 to wed and started a new and exciting life together. They had 6 children and lived in many different places, such as; Istanbul, Turkey; Heidelberg, Germany; Nuremberg, Germany, Virginia, Illinois, Kansas and Arizona. While in Germany she took piano lessons and became so good that she played for many churches



after that. Upon Larry's retirement from the Army in 1968, they moved to Tucson, but several years later Jeanne moved to Singapore while Larry was in Vietnam. She returned to Tucson again for a few years before moving to live in Iran for a few years. The next move was to Denver then Frisco, Colorado where she and Larry became the first Ambassadors at Copper Mountain Ski Resort. She enjoyed many years of downhill and cross-country skiing and winning many gold medals in the Senior Olympics. In 2001 she moved back again to Tucson/Oro Valley where she enjoyed singing in the choir, playing some golf and playing bridge and canasta. She attributes her longevity to good genes and healthy living. She misses Larry but still lives alone in her own house.
