The particular scene is after a battle in which the American raiding party got trounced and scattered. Men struggled back to their camp in an abandoned church in the middle of a swamp. They came in by ones, twos and threes beaten down and battled scared. They gathered to regroup and continue the fight. The other scene that comes to my mind is the end of the Exile as recorded in the Psalms, Ezra and Nehemiah. The Jews had been in Exile 70 years and only a few of them were left after the Exile who had seen the old temple and Jerusalem. When these few returned and saw the greatly diminished temple rebuilt it says, "But many of the older priests and Levites and family heads, who had seen the former temple, wept aloud when they saw the foundation of this temple being laid, while many others shouted for joy."

We, now, like the ancient Hebrews are coming back together again to lay a new foundation for the future. We mourn who and what we have lost and with great hope and faith look forward to the future. Like the writer of Psalm 126 said on return from the Exile,

When the Lord restored the fortunes of Zion, we were like those who dreamed.
Our mouths were filled with laughter, our tongues with songs of joy.
Then it was said among the nations, "The Lord has done great things for them."
The Lord has done great things for us, and we are filled with joy.



As we continue with our re-opening and offering programs that were scaled back during the pandemic, we're excited to announce that the Grocery Cart will be back out on the patio to collect your food donations for Impact's Catalina Food Bank on First Sunday of August (August 1st), to return to our full mission of First Sunday Food Bank gifts.

We are very appreciative of the monetary donations that made possible our continuing to support of the Food Bank during the pandemics, but now also want to return to our donations of food stuffs, that are collected for the first Sunday of the month. While all food stuffs are welcome, I was told that right now pasta, tomatoes (either diced or sauce) and soup (to which additional food can be added for a dinner) were especially helpful.

This is an important service to our community as our Food Bank distributes more than 460 bags monthly, totaling nearly 4000 lbs. of food, along with an additional 1300 lbs. of pantry goods, and thousands of pounds of produce, meat and dairy each month. **So let's** give thanks for our blessings and share them with others, to prevent hunger. The Covid pandemic has been a huge challenge for Pastor Gela as she continues to lead and minister to her congregation, so please keep her in your prayers!

A number of you have asked me about the cards made by the Women's Coop in Agua Prieta, make from your used cards. I have received a box of new cards and we will be selling them in the near future as we move forward with less restrictions. You're not going to see this many kinds of apples in the grocery store, but there are <u>7,500 varieties</u> of apples in existence throughout the world—2,500 of which are grown in the United States. (Found on Google Search.)

All apples have various skin colors and thicknesses, and taste ever so differently. Think of Christianity as the religion that accepts any bushel of apples regardless of skin color, thickness, or taste.

Children are children and each one is special, even a child born with Down Syndrome. In church I learned that some 90 % of pregnant women whose child will be born with Down Syndrome choose to have that child aborted. Finance Committee

June was a good month. Usually, income in the summer is low and doesn't cover expenses (average of \$39,000 monthly). More members are using ACH and credit card giving which really helps the church have a steadier income during the summer.

>Income was much better than April or May, since several members make a semi-annual pledge or fulfill an annual pledge: \$3,249 over budget.

>Expenses plus mortgage payment: (\$1,146) under budget

>General Fund Net Income almost broke even but was -\$427: \$4,395 over budget.

YTD our income is slightly less than 2020 and our expenses are less. General Fund Net Income is (\$6,265) less than 2020 due to mortgage payments.

We now owe \$413,041 on our mortgage. Attendance was 496 in person and a total of 1212 with

Leaving Your Legacy Through A Bequest

A popular way to leave a lasting legacy to your faith is to establish a bequest. A bequest is a gift from your estate—a transfer of cash, securities, or other property. You can make a gift to the Vista Permanent Endowment Fund by including language in your will or living trust dedicating a specific amount or percentage to the Fund. By including the PEF in your will, your investment will help Vista church keep the gospel message alive and growing.

Types of Bequest

Specific bequest: One of the many ways to support the PEF through your will or trust, and the easiest, is a bequest of a fixed dollar amount or specific property. If you would like your charitable gifts to remain in proportion to other bequests, you can designate a specific percentage of your estate, rather than a fixed amount, be given to the PEF.

Residuary bequest: If you do not wish to specify the exact size or nature of your charitable provision (often the size of a future estate is difficult to estimate), you might consider naming the PEF as a residual beneficiary of your estate. You may provide that all or a portion of the remainder of your estate shall pass to the PEF after other commitments have been fulfilled.
