So, into this mess the Savior of the world was born. Fitting place for the Savior to begin his work on behalf of us all for the mess of sin we find ourselves in.

But that was just the beginning. Soon they were on the road to Egypt and then they wound up in Nazareth. Things began badly, but in the end, turned into the salvation of the world. We are beginning a new year at Vista Church. 2022 has been quite a challenge but as things got better for Jesus and his family after the first Christmas, I trust the same for my family and for the Vista Church family in 2023. God holds our future in his hands, and we trust in him. As faithful as God has been in bringing us through the messes of the past we trust he will bring us into the future... come what may.

As I write this, I do not know my Mother-in-laws prognosis, but she is a faithful woman of God, so no matter the mess of this Christmas her place in heaven is assured forevermore. May you have such assurance in your life come the challenges of the New Year.

## Mission Outreach Ministry

To Our Vista Church Family:

This will be my last report to you as Chairman of Mission. It has truly been a great blessing to my life to be part of this ministry over the last 20 years. I want to thank you all for your amazing support over these past years. Your new Chairman will be Linda Galka. She is well qualified to take on this responsibility and we are excited to see where God leads our Mission program in the new year 2023. I will continue as a Team Leader for our ministry in Agua Prieta and the Memorial Day "Hearts Apart" Program at Davis Monthan AFB.

Speaking of Agua Prieta, our latest economic advancement project is, the Coffee Roasting and Coffee Shop "La Colonia" in downtown AP. We have received enough donations, \$2000.00 so now they can finish up the project. They plan to open the business in January. It is our goal that the shop will help support the ministry there and offer employment to a number of people. Good news, due to Pastor Fred's letter to the Visa office, Pastor Gela's Visa was renewed and she hopes to visit us in the near future when the Visa arrives in the next few months. We are praising God for this blessing.

Card sales have been disappointing, as it seems that folks are just not sending cards as they once did, but we want to thank all of you who bought cards and supported this ministry of the Women's Coop at our sister church in AP.

After putting a request in our last Echoes for diapers for both babies & adults, we have had a very good response and were able to deliver to Family 1<sup>st</sup> a car load last week.

Jan Bohe & her Creative Hands team have done a great job of making children's clothing for Christmas, for Family 1<sup>st</sup> and the clothing bank of Impact. Giff Tompkins who volunteers at the clothing bank says this beautiful stitchery goes out the door in a hurry with very happy families who get these lovely items.

Our Warm Winter Clothing & Bedding collection for Impact, is in progress thru the end of January 2023, the red Christmas Wrapped collection box is in the narthex between the front doors of the sanctuary. We are looking for winter coats, sweaters, socks and warm bedding. Clean used items are welcome as well as new. This has been a cold winter for Tucson so your donations for our community will be well received.

Esperanza en Escalante Vet Housing project in Tucson, requested money for 2 replacement stoves for the renovation of some of the older housing. Vista's UMM were very kind and supported the project with \$1,200.00 to buy the stoves. Concern was expressed about how much Mission money and effort is actually spent in the Catalina area. At present we have 5 of our ministries who directly serve the Catalina area, Family 1<sup>st</sup>, Creative Hands, Coronado School Snak Pak program, Impact Clothing Bank and also Impact Food Bank. We also have 3 programs for the homeless in the Pima county area, Sister Jose Homeless Women's Center, Emerge for Families in crisis and abusive situations, and Esperanza en Escalante for homeless Vets and their families. We are always open to suggestions to serve our community better and we welcome your ideas.

I want to wish you all a very Merry Christmas and God's blessing in the new Year 2023.

Please keep Linda Galka in your prayers as she begins her Chairmanship of this important part of the life and ministry at Vista and may God bless us all as we continue to meet the needs of others in our community and beyond. It has always been our goal to show the face of Christ in all the work we do.

### **Finance**

## January 2023 Finance Committee Report

**YTD:** Through the November, we continue to be very close to our income and expense budgets. Year-to-date we are \$6,402 over our income budget and (\$16,429) less than last year. Expenses plus mortgage payments are (\$637) under budget, resulting in a YTD General Fund Net Income that is \$7,039 over budget, but (\$5,017) less than last year.

**Month:** November was a good month! November Income was \$3,913 over budget. Expenses were \$1,327 over budget. Income was \$14,280 more last year and expenses were (\$4,279) less than last year. General Fund Net Income after our mortgage payment was \$4,611 which was \$2,035 over budget. November 2021 was a tough month!

**Mortgage:** We now owe \$288,362 on our mortgage!!!! As of mid-December 2022, we have received \$44,704 or 99.6% of our \$45,000 Lenten Challenge. We are now only \$296 away from our \$45,000 goal. If you would like to donate to the Mortgage Reduction Fund, please click the Donate link on our website to charge a gift, or write a check to Vista and indicate Mortgage Reduction on the Memo line.

**2023 Budget:** The Finance Committee recommended the following budget:

Pledges are budgeted to be \$25,200 under 2022, with about 15 less pledges, due to moves and deaths. The total income budget is \$419,993. This is a decrease of (\$46,309) from our 2022 estimate.

Total expenses, including our mortgage principal payment, are \$461,894. This is an increase of \$16,967 from the 2022 estimate. The increase is in payroll, due to cost-of-living increases, which were discussed at the Church Conference on October 30. The deficit is \$41,901.

For 2023 **only**, we approved covering the deficit by paying our \$42,100 in Apportionments from the \$50,552 Apportionment Reserve funds, that were reserved in 2019 - 2021. The approved General Fund Net Income is \$199. It will be critical in 2023 to grow our membership, so that we can increase the number of pledges and achieve our past income levels.
