Pastor's Pen—April 3, 2023

Dear members and friends of Vista Church, Jesus said, "I am the resurrection and the life; he who believes in me, though he die, yet shall he live, and whoever lives and believes in me shall never die. Do you believe this?"

This is a very appropriate verse for our April Echoes, as within this month we celebrate the resurrection of Jesus from the dead which is the basis and validation for all we believe in him. Now this phrase may be taken as "Pie in the sky by and by" statement but one phrase that needs careful attention is "whoever lives and believes in me shall never die." We are God's hands, arms, voices, and love as we sponsor this family here in America. They are living a new life with the outpouring of your support. I have been blessed to the core of my being by Vista Church's outpouring of love and support. Vista has not only stepped forward in a great way but as they have shared with others what we are doing here, other people, from all sorts of places have volunteered to step up and help as they can.

On behalf of Jesus, I want to say, "Well done good and faithful servants" of our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ. In this season in which we celebrate the resurrection of Jesus you have participated in the offering of new life. And part of the beauty of it is that you will be able to see that lived out in our midst.

Vista Finance Committee Echoes: April, 2023

February 2023 YTD

Income is \$5,444 more than the budget, but \$16,007 less than last year due to less pre-paid pledges. Expenses are \$1,053 over budget and \$6,904 more than 2022. General Fund Net Income is \$1,692 better than our budget but \$24,224 less than last year.

The February expense increase in 2023 over 2022 was due to increases in staff, postage, and utilities. Additionally, in 2022 we received credits in the marketing and printer lease accounts.

February 2023

We exceeded our revenue budget by \$3,101 but income was \$1,086 less than last year due to \$1,200 less in General Offering. Expenses plus mortgage payments were \$1,668 over budget, resulting in a General Fund Net Income that is \$1,433 over budget, but \$8,881 less than last year.

Mortgage:

We now owe \$229,980 on our mortgage!!!! The Lenten Challenge has begun!!

Account Updates:

Our checking and ACH accounts at Canyon Bank were closed the last week of March. The checking, ACH and savings accounts are at Chase Bank.

In addition, youth will learn what it means to live the Christian life and be involved in the mission of the church in the world. The other thing that needs to happen in a confirmation program is spiritual formation. Our faith is not just about information. It is about formation – being molded, shaped, or transformed into the image of Christ. This takes time and experiences, not just data. A comprehensive confirmation program is more than just a class. It seeks to provide experiences and opportunities in which the child can be shaped as a Christian (i.e., worship, relationships with peers and mentors, small group experiences, mission and ministry opportunities, etc.). These experiences make young people aware of how God is working in their lives and how they respond to God's call to them.

AGUA PRIETA SCHOOLS PROJECT



The Agua Prieta 2023-2024 Schools Project is beginning once more at Vistal

Last summer Vista church members provided school supplies and backpacks for over 100 children including University students at our sister church Fuente de Vida (Fountain of Life). The School Supplies Mission Project is part of our Mission Committee's Economic Development Program in Aqua Prieta (AP), Mexico.

A donation of \$30 per student buys the long list of school supplies and backpacks required for students to attend the public schools.

Letters are being sent in May to past student sponsors giving them an opportunity to keep their same student (if the student is still in Agua Prieta) for the 2023-2024 school year. Newly interested sponsors will be given a chance to sign up June 11 and 18.
