Our Ukrainian family moved into their new apartment on Wednesday April 19<sup>th</sup>. They are staying in an apartment whose owner has a special relationship with Lutheran Social Services (LSS). LSS put up the security deposit and the owner of this apartment allowed them to move in without proof of income with our Church supplying the first two months rent. Apartments are scarce and the rents are very high, so it was quite a blessing for all concerned for them to be able to move in after staying with my wife Deede and I for five weeks.

On Wednesday, two trucks, one with a trailer, showed up at Linda Griffin's house who donated many pieces of furniture and other items for them to set up their apartment. A queen bed came from a person from Saddlebrook Ranch who read about our efforts and wanted to help and another one came from the Philippi's. There were so many people who donated time and money and resources from our church and our community. Indeed, we fulfilled the scripture, "In the same way, let your light shine before others, that they may see your good deeds and glorify your Father in heaven." What you have done for this family - Maksym, Katy and Sandra has been truly inspiring and has led many others outside our church join in our efforts and give glory to our Father in Heaven.

Wednesday, the day of the move into their apartment, an army of volunteers showed up at Linda Griffin's to load up and transport the many items. Stuart Watkins commented, "it was like an old-fashioned barn raising." Everyone did their part as they were able and soon the family was in their new home with a pile of mystery bags and boxes to open and find the surprises and blessings inside.

On Thursday we were able to take the Family to Oracle Ford Dealership who gave us a special deal on the purchase of a car for the family. A member of the church had given \$5,000.00 for this effort and the car cost \$4925.00. Enough left over for a tank of gas!!

My words fail me in describing how much you as a church have inspired me through your efforts and how much your efforts have inspired those in our community. It is an honor and a privilege to serve you as your pastor.



### Vista Finance Committee Echoes: May, 2023

#### March 2023 YTD

Income is \$6,652 more than the budget, but \$21,084 less than last year due to less pre-paid pledges and less General Offerings. Expenses are \$70 over budget and \$7,480 more than 2022. General Fund Net Income is \$6,582 better than our budget but \$30,346 less than last year. We are achieving our General Offering budget and Collection Plate Income is ahead of budget and last year by \$580.

#### March 2023

We exceeded our revenue budget by \$1,209 but income was \$5,077 less than last year due to \$5,338 less in General Offering. Expenses plus mortgage payments were \$1,263 under budget, resulting in a General Fund Net Income that is \$2,472 over budget, but -\$2,660.

### Mortgage:

Ending March, we now owe \$217,081 on our mortgage!!!! We have met 26% of our \$45,000 Lenten Challenge!! Early April results are very encouraging!!

### **Account Updates:**

Our checking and ACH accounts at Canyon Bank were closed the last week of March. The checking, ACH and savings accounts are at Chase Bank. We are now using a credit card account with Commerce Bank that is for non-profits, has no fee and is guaranteed by the Church, not an individual.

### ACH - Automated Clearing House

Many of our members give through ACH – Automated Clearing House, which is a monthly direct deposit to the Church from your checking account. If you would like to do this, please email Financevistaumc@gmail.com.

### Non-cash Gifts to the Church – Stocks or Property

Anytime you wish to make a non-cash gift to the Church (i.e., stocks or property), it is critical that you email <a href="mailto:Financevistaumc@gmail.com">Financevistaumc@gmail.com</a> for the proper procedures. You can complete your general pledge or building pledge through a stock gift, which may provide a tax incentive if you donate appreciated stock.

#### IRA Gift from your Required Minimum Distribution (RMD)

Retirees ages 73 or older can transfer money tax free directly from their IRA to a charity such as Vista UMC and it can count towards your RMD (Required Minimum Distribution). It is important to consult your Financial Adviser to set this up properly.

#### Fry's Community Rewards

Vista de la Montana UMC is enrolled as a member of Fry's Community Rewards Program. Our Member Number is 22553. Our church will receive a quarterly rebate.

<u>PLEASE NOTE:</u> Before you can link your Fry's V.I.P card to an organization, you must have an email address and an on-line account.





**Confirmation** seeks to give the youth a systematic overview of the faith - our identity, our history and heritage, our practices, and our beliefs. This will include both our heritage and practices as a Christian community and as a United Methodist Family, as well as our basic beliefs and commitments. In addition, youth will learn what it means to live the Christian life and be involved in the mission of the church in the world. The other thing that needs to happen in a confirmation program is spiritual formation. Our faith is not just about information. It is about formation – being molded, shaped, or transformed into the image of Christ. This takes time and experiences, not just data. A comprehensive confirmation program is more than just a class. It seeks to provide experiences and opportunities in which the child can be shaped as a Christian (i.e., worship, relationships with peers and mentors, small group experiences, mission and ministry opportunities, etc.). These experiences make young people aware of how God is working in their lives and how they respond to God's call to them.

### Report from our sister Church Fuente de Vida in Agua Prieta, Mexico

I was my joy to have a visit with Pastor Gela this past week and I want to give you an update on what has been taking place so far this year at our sister Church.

- On Jan. 9, 2023, house churches opened their doors and are hosting bible studies in their homes, inviting friends and neighbors to participate.
- In Feb, 2023, 58 couples participated in a couple's retreat held at a public auditorium and open to the general public to participate, along with the church community. A good number of couples came to faith for the first time due to the sharing, not only of their love for each other, but hearing of the love that our Lord has for them.
- A new Bishop has been elected for the area, covering from Baja California to the East end of the State of Sonora. Every month there is a meeting of all Pastors in his extensive district by Zoom and they can share needs and give support to each other, as well as hearing about all the activities of their various congregations.
- We agreed on the next Celebration of Learning date which will be held on Saturday the 28<sup>th</sup> of this year, 2023. Many thanks were given for our last visit and their gratitude for all we share with them during the year.
- Pastor Gela was here with Pastor Armando on Feb 28<sup>th</sup> and were able to clean our store room of all your contributions
  to their Ministry. A very special thanks to Beeler Watts for all of Cheryl's wardrobe that was shared with several Pastors of other churches.
- We were so pleased to receive a Check for \$1,900. from our partners in this program at Sun Lakes UMC to pay for the spring tuition of our Public High School students in AP.
- The Coffee shop is just about to open and is being completely renovated with new paint décor, cabinetry, signage and equipment. Pastor Gela's daughter and son-in-law will be running the shop. I have asked for photos to share with you at the opening. Many thanks for all of you that have made this opening possible.
- El dia de los NInos (the day of the children) will be celebrated on 4-30 at the Colonia. Bible Superheroes stories will be acted out in homemade costumes and families will celebrate this annual event with great fun at the church.
- In May there will be a big celebration of Mother's Day, as well as Pentecost Sunday at the end of the month. All these special days on the calendar are times to come and celebrate the occasion with special programs, food and fellowship.
- We received Easter cards a little late this year, but were still able to send the Ladies Co-op \$150.00 in sales.
- We have new cards in the display in the Narthex for your purchase for only 50 cents. Thanks for helping support this Economic Advancement Endeavor.

Thank you all for your support for our sister church as we share this ministry together. I will be reporting to you every quarter what is happening with our Fuente de Vida partnership.

### Endowment — 2023 O1 Report

The Endowment fund showed some improvement in the first quarter of 2023. Your fund was up 4.7% in the quarter, but still well below its high water mark in December 2021. The major averages — DJIA, Nasdaq, and S&P — were up .42%, 17.6%, and 7.4% respectively. In spite of this relatively good news, the outlook remains gloomy, with most economists predicting additional interest rate hikes and a possible recession later this year or early next year.

With the current investing environment and the future outlook, your committee will maintain its moratorium on funding requests through June 2023. We will review the situation at the end of the second quarter to determine if a change to our position is warranted.

In the interim, we will keep our funds fully invested in a balanced portfolio of both large and small-cap stocks and bonds.



### AGUA PRIETA SCHOOLS PROJECT



The Agua Prieta 2023-2024 Schools Project is beginning once more at Vistal

Last summer Vista church members provided school supplies and backpacks for over 100 children including University students at our sister church Fuente de Vida (Fountain of Life). The School Supplies Mission Project is part of our Mission Committee's Economic Development Program in Aqua Prieta (AP), Mexico.

A donation of \$30 per student buys the long list of school supplies and backpacks required for students to attend the public schools.

Letters are being sent in May to past student sponsors giving them an opportunity to keep their same student (if the student is still in Agua Prieta) for the 2023-2024 school year. Newly interested sponsors will be given a chance to sign up June 11 and 18.
