It is said that "Volunteers don't get paid, not because they are worthless, but because they are priceless." This is especially true here at Vista where our **Landscaping Crew** maintains a ten-acre campus. Our Volunteers also support nearly twenty specific missions, manages nearly a dozen committees and leads a congregation of more than three hundred souls with a paid staff of three full-time and two part-time. Here at Vista, Volunteers are indeed the heartbeat of our church.

One of the most interesting parts of a lay leader's job is to represent the laity on all church Committees. This gives me a perspective on what is happening at Vista and I have noticed that with the departure of our wonderful snowbirds, we have an even greater opportunity, and indeed, a responsibility to be a Volunteer for making successful summer activities for the greater glory of God and our church. I thought you might well be one of those who would like to be a Volunteer if you were reminded of some of the things there are to do. Here are a few that might make you say, "How can I help?"

This involves both attention to new people coming to worship at Vista, or writing articles in local papers and online which describe the great things we do here. Check with Leslie Hawkins, Evangelism chair if you have ideas for encouraging this Ministry, wish to serve on this committee or would like to write articles. Perhaps you would like to enrich your own spiritual life by taking a course as the courses not only increase your knowledge of the Bible and enrich your spirituality, but they also provide fellowship opportunities that also strengthen faith and friendships. New classes begin in July, 2023 and you can check with me about those.

Office needs people to answer phones, act as receptionists, and perform various clerical functions, particularly in the afternoon. Please speak with the Office Manager, Kellen Adams, about Volunteering there.

Worship Committee needs help with the flowers in the Sanctuary during the summer. Anyone who enjoys flowers could become a Volunteer for this. Pastor's Pen

June 2023

Acts 2:2, "Suddenly a sound like the blowing of a violent wind came from heaven and filled the whole house where they were sitting." The following story is given to you for your edification and inspiration. One of our members who moved away some time ago came to me before they left and said they wanted to tithe on the proceeds of the sale of their home. They, like many, over the last several years were moving to be close to children and family as aging took its toll. Part of the tithe (\$20,000.00) went to the "2023 Lenten Mortgage Challenge" and the rest is going to other special projects for the church and its mission and ministries.

I tell this story to inspire others to consider tithing to the church on the sale of properties and other valuable assets. The Spirit is indeed poured out on us as we gather in the House of the Lord and as we use our homes for the glory of God. As Hebrews 3:4 says: "For every house is built by someone, but God is the builder of everything." In so doing we join in the work of God.

2 Corinthians 5:1 says: "For we know that if the earthly tent we live in is destroyed, we have a building from God, an eternal house in heaven, not built by human hands."

I turned 67 this year and it has caused a time of reflection as I look back over the last 42 years of Ordained Ministry and five years of Lay Ministry before that. I consider how richly blessed by God I have been in that Deede, and I bought our first home in 1998. This first home was a mess in that it had been a rental for 10 years and both the owner and the tenants treated it with little respect. For seven years Deede and I worked very hard to address issues from electrical, to plumbing, to the roof and slab leaks, re-stuccoing, new cabinets, redoing the irrigation system and the list of projects was seemingly endless. But one day the projects did end. The Bishop moved us and we sold the "mess of a house" that had become a loving home at the height of the last housing bubble which allowed us to purchase our present home.

Pastors coming behind me do not have such luxury of the building and construction skills I learned from my dad and perfectly timed housing markets. Many pastors coming up behind me are still paying off their student loans well into their 40s. This makes buying a home all but impossible and so Vista Church needs to think about who comes after me and the cost of housing for the next pastor (I am less than five years to mandatory retirement). Parsonages are looking better and better for younger pastors.

So... I remind you of a story I told several years ago about my in-laws donating their home in South Padre Texas to the little United Methodist church they attended. That parsonage allowed pastors to serve there that could never afford to buy property in that expensive tourist area. When I spoke about this several years ago it inspired one of our members, John Rubin, to donate his manufactured home, and the land on which it stood, to the Church. So, this is an appeal again, to the members of Vista Church to consider leaving their home to the church in their will. When our "earthly tent is destroyed" there will be others here on earth called to Pastor at Vista Church, and they will need a home here on earth to live in, and Minister from. I lift this up for your consideration and to the glory of God. Knowing this "Ask and it shall be given to you." I ask not for myself, but for whoever one day will pick up my stole when I lay it down.

Confirmation Classes

Three Vista Youth are attending classes every Wednesday night! Please include these youth and their families in your prayers.

Confirmation seeks to give the youth a systematic overview of the faith - our identity, our history and heritage, our practices, and our beliefs. This will include both our heritage and practices as a Christian community and as a United Methodist Family, as well as our basic beliefs and commitments. In addition, youth will learn what it means to live the Christian life and be involved in the mission of the church in the world. The other thing that needs to happen in a confirmation program is spiritual formation. Our faith is not just about information. It is about formation - being molded, shaped, or transformed into the image of Christ. This takes time and experiences, not just data. A comprehensive confirmation program is more than just a class. It seeks to provide experiences and opportunities in which the child can be shaped as a Christian (i.e., worship, relationships with peers and mentors, small group experiences, mission and ministry opportunities, etc.). These experiences make young people aware of how God is working in their lives and how they respond to God's call to them.

Vista Finance Committee Echoes: JUNE, 2023

April 2023 YTD: Income is \$9,270 more than the budget, but \$36,082 less than last year due to less pre-paid pledges and less General Offerings. Expenses, plus the Mortgage Principal Payment, are \$2,745 over budget and \$8,292 more than 2022. General Fund Net Income is \$6,525 better than our budget but \$44,374 less than last year. We are achieving our General Offering budget and Collection Plate Income is ahead of budget by \$580 from last year. We exceeded our revenue budget by \$2,618 and last year by \$2,624. Expenses, plus mortgage payments were \$2,675 over budget resulting in a General Fund Net Income that is \$57 under budget.

Mortgage: Ending April, we now owe \$183,774 on our mortgage!!!! We have met 100.4% of our \$45,000 Lenten Challenge!!

Payroll: We will begin doing automatic payroll direct deposits through Chase Bank as soon as they can be set up .

<u>ACH – Automated Clearing House:</u> Many of our members give through ACH – Automated Clearing House, which is a monthly direct deposit to the Church from your checking account. If you would like to do this, please email <u>Financevistaumc@gmail.com</u>.

Non-Cash Gifts to the Church – Stocks or Property: Anytime you wish to make a non-cash gift to the Church (i.e., stocks or property), it is critical that you email <u>Financevistaumc@gmail.com</u> for the proper procedures. You can complete your general pledge or building pledge through a stock gift which could provide a tax incentive if you donate appreciated stock.

IRA Gift from your Required Minimum Distribution (RMD): Retirees ages 73 or older can transfer money tax free directly from their IRA to a charity such as Vista UMC and it can count towards your RMD (Required Minimum Distribution). It is important to consult your Financial Adviser to set this up properly.

<u>Fry's Community Rewards</u>: Vista de la Montana UMC is enrolled as a member of Fry's Community Rewards Program. Our Member Number is 22553. Our church will receive a quarterly rebate.
