Pastor's Pen

Dear members and friends of Vista Church,

In July, as I get older, my thoughts turn more to thoughts of freedom than to fireworks, family and apple pie as they did when I was much younger. I have come more and more to understand how fragile freedom is and how it has to be constantly defended. It needs to be defended from those who want to take it away in their striving for power over others, and in the harsh application of laws. It also needs to be defended from those who would turn freedom into a license to sin. This is an ancient battle for Christians that goes all the way back to the writing of the book of Galatians and is as old as this Nation we call home. It is as present as the chaos we see on the streets of many of our large cities.

Paul put it this way, which is one of the most famous verses in the book of Galatians: "It is for freedom that Christ has set us free. Stand firm, then, and do not let yourselves be burdened again by a yoke of slavery." The yoke of slavery was both an over application of the Law and an under application of the Law from some who said: "Since I am free in Christ from the consequences of sin and the Law which points out those sins, I can do whatever I want to do. I can 'sin' however I want to. Jesus will forgive me."

Paul makes a pointed reply to this, "¹⁹ The acts of the flesh are obvious: sexual immorality, impurity, and debauchery; ²⁰ idolatry and witchcraft; hatred, discord, jealousy, fits of rage, selfish ambition, dissensions, factions ²¹ and envy; drunkenness, orgies, and the like. I warn you, as I did before, that those who live like this will not inherit the kingdom of God." And then he points out what life looks like living by the Law of Love, "²² But the fruit of the Spirit is love, joy, peace, forbearance, kindness, goodness, faithfulness, ²³ gentleness and self-control. Against such things there is no law. ²⁴ Those who belong to Christ Jesus have crucified the flesh with its passions and desires. ²⁵ Since we live by the Spirit, let us keep in step with the Spirit." The joy of the "Fruits of the Spirit" is that we can grow in them throughout our lifetime blessing others and ourselves as we practice them.

One final Scriptural thought on freedom comes from 2 Corinthians 3:17, "Now the Lord is the Spirit, and where the Spirit of the Lord is, there is freedom."

I pray we live by the Spirit and thus enjoy the Spirit's freedom and I pray that we as a Nation may welcome the Spirit of God so we can continue to be free.

Stephen Ministers are lay congregation members trained to provide **one-to-one** care to those experiencing a difficult time in life, such as grief, divorce, job loss, chronic or terminal illness, or relocation.

Using resources from Stephen Ministries St. Louis, Stephen Minister training equips them to provide high-quality care to people who are hurting. Initial Stephen Minister Training is 50 hours of classroom training followed by continuing education, support and guidance.

After being matched with a person experiencing a life crisis, the Stephen Minister meets with that person on a weekly basis to listen, care, encourage, and provide emotional and spiritual support. The caring relationship lasts as long as the need for care exists and is totally confidential.

CONFIRMATION CLASSES

Confirmation

Seeks to give the youth a systematic overview of the faith - our identity, our history and heritage, our practices, and our beliefs. This will include both our heritage and practices as a Christian community and as a United Methodist Family, as well as our basic beliefs and

commitments. In addition, youth will learn what it means to live the Christian life and be involved in the mission of the church in the world. The other thing that needs to happen in a confirmation program is spiritual formation. Our faith is not just about information.

It is about formation – being molded, shaped, or transformed into the image of Christ. This takes time and experiences, not just data. A comprehensive confirmation program is more than just a class. It seeks to provide experiences and opportunities in which the child can be shaped as a Christian (i.e., worship, relationships with peers and mentors, small group experiences, mission and ministrv opportunities, etc.). These experiences make young people aware of how God is working in their lives and how they respond to God's call to them.

STATIONS OF THE CROSS

Thanks to Memorial funds given to Stephen Ministry: we are beginning the process to establish a "Stations of the Cross" around the Labyrinth. The landscape crew has been hard at work smoothing the path and clearing away brush and cactus.

The fourteen crosses will each be unique: about 5 feet tall or can be mounted on a 5 foot pole, and must be made of a medium that can withstand the desert heat and insects.

July 2023 Echoes - Vista UMC Finance Committee

May 2023 YTD

Income is \$432 under the budget, and \$9,046 less than last year, due to less pre-paid pledges. Expenses are on budget and higher than 2022. General Fund Net Income is on budget, but less than last year. We are achieving our General Offering budget and the Collection Plate Income is ahead of budget and last year.

<u>May 2023</u>

We were under our revenue budget in May by \$1,602 and \$8,233 less than last year. Expenses plus mortgage payments were over budget, resulting in a General Fund Net Income that is under budget, and less than last year. The May income results were very concerning.

<u>Mortgage</u>

Ending May, we now owe \$181,408 on our mortgage!!!! The May gifts to the new "2023 \$45,000 Challenge" were \$2,051.

<u>Attendance</u>

Attendance was 1129 vs. 1397 last year.

<u>Mid-year Statements</u>

We will be sending out mid-year statements in July.

Anytime you wish to make a non-cash gift to the Church (i.e., stocks or property), it is critical that you email <u>Financevistaumc@gmail.com</u> for the proper procedures. You can complete your general pledge or building pledge through a stock gift, which may provide a tax incentive if you donate appreciated stock.

IRA Gift from your Required Minimum Distribution (RMD)

Retirees ages 73 or older can transfer money tax free directly from their IRA to a charity such as Vista UMC and it can count towards your RMD (Required Minimum Distribution). It is important to consult your Financial Adviser to set this up properly.
