Dear members and friends of Vista Church,

As I write this it is 108 degrees outside. This is the 41st day of 100 degrees plus in Tucson. It is five months to Christmas and one month past the Summer Solstice. I heard on the news that the Earth in the Northern Hemisphere continues to get warmer and warmer for a month after the Summer Solstice before it starts to cool off. It's been a month since July 21st so let's pray they are right and things will start to cool off, though at this moment it feels like it never will. We can now start to look forward to the coldest days of the year about one month after the winter solstice on December 21st. This all made me think of the famous verses about seasons in the Book of Ecclesiastes chapter 3:

and a season for every activity under the heavens:
- ² a time to be born and a time to die,
a time to plant and a time to uproot,

They are moving to Chicago. The mom's allergies here in Tucson were literally killing her. The medications the Doctor prescribed was taking a toll on her health, as well as the daily struggle to breathe. So, they are going to move to Chicago to a Ukrainian Enclave. They have family there and people from their home town in Ukraine, that as I write this, has undergone recent bombardment. Pray for their friends and relatives who are struggling to survive under Russian occupation.

Keep praying as we all go through our seasons of life on many different levels.

Immigration and the Bible

“A journey of a thousand miles begins with a single step.” So wrote Lao Tzu in the 6th century B.C.E. This is a journey we have seen many times on our TVs, as desperate migrants leave their homeland for safe haven elsewhere. Globally, some 200 million people are on the move. How do we understand this phenomenon, and what is ours to do.

For many American Christians, immigration requires another kind of a journey, not a physical one but a spiritual one. How do we move from ignorance to understanding, from judgment to empathy, from anger to compassion. When we look to scripture, what do we find, what do we remember. When we look to Jesus, and inside our own hearts, how do we respond as Christ-followers?

“A Mile in My Shoes: Immigration and the Bible” is a spiritual retreat and an immersion experience, an inward journey and a physical journey as we plunge into one of the most challenging issues of our day. Sponsored by the Desert Southwest Conference of the United Methodist Church, this event is open to lay and clergy leaders from any denomination who are committed to deepening their faith and engaging the world. The dates are October 22-27, 2023, at Redemptorist Renewal Center in Tucson (<http://desertrenewal.org>).

Adapting the Upper Room’s highly regarded Academy for Spiritual Formation model, this event includes two full days of immersion, visiting migrant shelters and the border wall, listening to asylum seekers and activists, reflecting on what we have seen and heard. First though we’ll study the scriptures with author and faculty presenter, Karen Gonzalez. Karen’s two books *The God Who Sees: Immigrants the Bible*, and *the Journey to Belong* (2019) and *Beyond Welcome: Centering Immigrants in our Christian Response to Immigration* (2022) tell her own compelling story, as she moved to the US from Guatemala with her family as a child. Encountering loss and alienation, prejudice and compassion, she found hope in scripture and in the church. Artfully and intimately woven into her narrative, her witness opens many places for dialogue and reorientation. Besides her own story, Karen includes insights from her work with immigrants in the nonprofit sector, offering a big picture perspective on immigration policy and practice that every reader will appreciate. Karen’s presentations will bookend our gathering, and her presence will be felt throughout the week.

The cost of the retreat, including lodging, faculty presentations and transportation to the various venues is \$925 (for single accommodations) and \$825 (for shared accommodations). Scholarships are available. First time participants are particularly welcome. This is the 15th Five Day Academy for Spiritual Formation offered by the Desert Southwest Conference. The adaptation of the original model has been approved by The Upper Room’s Academy Director, Johnny Sears. CONFIRMATION

Seeks to give the youth a systematic overview of the faith, our identity, our history and heritage, our practices, and our beliefs. This will include both our heritage and practices as a Christian community and as a United Methodist Family, as well as our basic beliefs and commitments. In addition, youth will learn what it means to live the Christian life and be involved in the mission of the Church in the World. The other thing that needs to happen in a confirmation program is spiritual formation. Our faith is not just about information.

It is about formation: Being molded, shaped, or transformed into the image of Christ. This takes time and experiences, not just data. A comprehensive confirmation program is more than just a class. It seeks to provide experiences and opportunities in which the child can be shaped as a Christian (i.e., worship, relationships with peers and mentors, small group experiences, mission and ministry opportunities, etc.). These experiences make young people aware of how God is working in their lives and how they respond to God's call to them.

Endowment — 2023 Q2 Report

The Endowment fund showed some improvement in the second quarter of 2023. Your fund was up 3.35% in the quarter and, combined with the Q1 improvement, brought the yearly performance to 8.06%. The major averages were all up in the second quarter, led by the tech-heavy Nasdaq up nearly 13%, Dow up 3.4%, and the S&P 500 up 8.3%. While this performance contributed to our good news, your fund remains more than 9.5% below its maximum value. Inflation remains higher than the Federal Reserve target of 2% and they continue to signal additional future interest rate hikes to help lower inflation. Further, most economists are still predicting a recession, likely delayed until 2024. Increasing interest rates and a recession are generally not positive for market performance.

Because these future outlooks are never certain, we will continue to monitor the fund performance, but for now we feel it prudent to maintain our moratorium on funding through Q3. June 2023:

June was the **smallest** revenue month we have had in years! We were under our revenue budget by \$4,865, and \$8,616 less than last year. Expenses plus mortgage payments were on budget, resulting in a General Fund Net Income that is under budget, and less than last year. We had a net income loss of \$23,236. The May and June income results are **very** concerning. June has high expenses due to our semi-annual insurance payment of \$6,665.

June 2023 YTD: Income is \$4,394 under the budget, and \$16,760 less than last year. Expenses are on budget and but higher than 2022. General Fund Net Income is under budget, and under than last year. We have a Net Income Loss of -\$8,984.

Mortgage: Ending June, we now owe \$173,123 on our mortgage!!!! The June gifts to the new "2023 \$45,000 Challenge" were \$1,315.

Reimbursements, Checks and Contribution Inquiries: Darrell, Anne and Sharon process checks only on Monday morning. Any check requests should be in the Finance mailbox before 9:00 AM on Monday morning. Reimbursement requests must include a completed yellow sheet and the invoice/receipt. Mary and Linda process deposits only on Tuesday mornings. Any inquiries should be sent to the Finance email address Financevistaumc@gmail.com prior to Tuesday morning and they will be responded to at that time.

Mid-year Statements: We sent them out mid-year statements in July. If you didn't receive yours, please contact the Finance email: Financevistaumc@gmail.com. The committee met in June and will not meet again until September when we will begin the 2024 Stewardship Campaign.
