Pastor's Report, November 2023

Dear Members and Friends of Vista Church,

This past Sunday, October 22nd, will be known as "The Sunday of the Bees"! We had a hive of bees make its way into the Sanctuary even though they had been poisoned the Thursday before. Leo Smith vacuumed up piles of bees twice on Saturday and once on Sunday. As I write this, honey is dripping from the ceiling of the soffit closest to the AV Booth. What a brave group who stayed and did their work despite a few angry bees still hanging around. But for the rest of the congregation, we taped off the east side of the Sanctuary so that everyone sat in the two west sections. Half the church looked packed, and the other half was completely empty.

At one point I realized that the pulpit was tilted towards the AV Booth and camera 4 which is the angle most people see us when they watch online. But...there was no one in those seats so I turned the pulpit towards the people sitting in front of me. In that moment several thoughts passed through my mind. The first thought was that all those "150 empty seats" were actually filled with the roughly 150 people who join us in worship every week online. They were present in spirit. Most are our members in other parts of the country, but randomly we get people from Africa, Europe and other parts of the world.

My second thought followed the first and that is "that we are surrounded by a great cloud of witness," not only those online, but also those who have gone before us and now worship with us in heaven. In just a few days we will be celebrating "All Saints Sunday" here at Vista Church and remembering all the saints of our church who have passed on since the last "All Saints Sunday", they indeed are part of the "great cloud of witnesses" who once sat in those empty seats last Sunday.

In my mind two great Holidays always occur in November, the first of which is All Saints Sunday and the second is Thanksgiving. We begin the month celebrating all those friends and family who once sat among us and giving thanks for their lives, love, and faith. And we end the month thanking God for all that he has given us, all that we are, and all that we ever will be on earth as one day in Heaven. Yes, November is a great month of Holidays and usually in the middle we have a great big celebration luncheon thanking God for all that He has given us that we can give back to him.

Indeed, Hebrews 12:1-2 reminds us that we can look back to those who inspired us to help us run the race of faith as well as look forward with Thanksgiving to the prize that lies before us. "Therefore, since we are surrounded by so great a cloud of witnesses, let us also lay aside every weight and the sin that clings so closely, and let us run with perseverance the race that is set before us, looking to Jesus, the pioneer and perfecter of our faith, who for the sake of the joy that was set before him endured the cross, disregarding its shame, and has taken his seat at the right hand of the throne of God."

May our November together be a month of thanksgiving, looking back at those we loved, appreciating what we have, and looking forward to what is to come.

Vista Church presented Emerge with a \$600 check to assist in their outreach to women and children who are escaping the cycle of domestic abuse.

Impact Food Bank: *Food donations remain at a critically low level*. September donations totaled 74 pounds. Thank you Church! A great effort! Unfortunately, the need still remains critically high. The total cost for all three students for their entire four-year college education is \$15,500. The church responded to their need and we are close to reaching this goal! October 2023 Echoes Article - Vista UMC Finance Committee

August 2023:

Revenue was \$30,025. We exceeded our revenue budget by \$1,625, but revenue was \$11,431 less than last year. Expenses plus mortgage payments were \$33,359, which was \$1,387 under budget and slightly less than last year. Our General Fund Net Income was a loss of (\$3,514) and \$11,500 than last year.

August 2023 Year-to-Date:

Year-to-date Income is \$1,000 under the budget and \$34,017 less than last year. Expenses are \$5,218 under budget, but \$13,522 higher than 2022. We have a Year-to-date General Fund Net Income Loss of (\$18,369). General Fund Net Income is (\$1,128) under budget, and (\$49,728) less than last year. Our Operating Reserve is still \$110,919 because we are able to pay our Apportionments out of the Apportionment Reserve Account.

2023 Estimate:

We have had a difficult summer for income. The estimate for the annual revenue is \$400,000 which will be \$20,000 under the budget. Expenses, plus our mortgage principal payment, will be about \$14,000 under budget. Our net General Fund Net Income will be an estimated—\$5,700.

Mortgage:

Ending June, we now owe \$166,854 on our mortgage!!!! The August gifts to the new "2023 \$45,000 Challenge" were \$1,573. Our goal is to be under \$150,000 by year-end.

Reimbursements, Checks and Contribution Inquiries:

Darrell, Anne and Sharon process reimbursement checks only on Monday mornings. Any check requests should be in the Finance mailbox before 9:00 AM on Monday morning. Reimbursement requests must include a completed yellow sheet and the invoice/receipt attached. Mary and Linda process deposits only on Tuesday mornings. Any inquiries should be sent to the Finance email address *Finance*<u>vistaumc@gmail.com</u> prior to Tuesday morning and they will be responded to at that time.

Attendance:

Total Attendance was 1055 vs 1413 last year. In-person attendance was 454 vs. 478 last year. Facebook attendance increased from 239 to 277 and Live Stream decreased from 696 to 324.

2024 General Operating Budget:

Work has begun on next year's budget. All committees with accounts included in the General Operating Budget were given budget request packages at the Church Council Meeting on September 19, 2023. Budget requests are due October 31, 2023 but a final budget proposal is not prepared by the Finance Committee to submit to the Church Council until late November 2023 after the conclusion of the Stewardship Campaign, when we know what the projected income will be.

Save the Date!!! Consecration Sunday is November 12, 2023.

Endowment — 2023 Q3 Report

The Endowment fund showed positive returns in both the first and second quarters, but, unfortunately that trend did not continue in Q3. Rather it reversed with the fund declining 3.04% bringing our yearly performance to +4.76%. This was not a surprise as the major averages S&P, Dow, and Nasdaq were all down in the quarter, -3.6%, -2.6%, and -4.1% respectively. Inflation is still a problem and while there has been progress, it remains above the Federal Reserve target of 2%. The current month number was 3.7% year over year, unchanged from September. Many economists are suggesting that an additional interest rate hike may be necessary this year. Coupled with the World's geopolitical situation, it is difficult to see much positive happening in the market.

However, the market typically rallies going into year-end, but as I write this the fund is down slightly from the end of September balance. I wish the news were better so we could begin funding projects. But for now, we feel it prudent to maintain our moratorium on funding through Q4.
