Hi Friends,

It's August and this is my first newsletter note to you. In just a short time as your pastor, I have come to realize that Vista de la Montaña has many faithful and dedicated members. And that you all enjoy each other's company! My staff meetings have been so fruitful and energizing for me. The Spirit of God is truly at work. Our Staff Parish Relations chair, Dan Boring introduced you to me in last month's newsletter, so you know a bit about me already, but I wanted to share a bit about what you will hear from me over the next couple of years. In scripture both the Hebrew Scriptures (Old Testament) and the Christian Scriptures (New Testament) we have many themes. For me the theme of love stands out as a ribbon of grace from the beginning of time til now. Whenever I read scripture, I like to look for God's grace in the story or the Proverb or Psalm. One of the ways we see this is in God's directive to the Hebrew people to Love their neighbor. Jesus said this too right? No other commandment greater than loving God with our body, mind, and spirit and to love your neighbor as yourself. I have a hunch that Jesus told his disciples and others many many times to love their neighbor. One time a religious expert in the biblical law asked Jesus to explain this neighbor thing = "Who is my neighbor," he asked. And Jesus told a story. Through this story, the story of the Good Samaritan, and the way Jesus lived his life we have come to understand that our neighbor is all people - the person who lives next door, every person we encounter and all those who we haven't met yet. Virtually everyone. Loving our neighbors in big ways and simple ways will be a theme in my messages because it seems like that was Jesus' message too. In Jesus' time when folks departed from one another they would say, "Shalom" wishing their friend or acquaintance peace and good health. I have a hunch Jesus added, "Go love your neighbor!"

Insuring Your Legacy and Vista de la Montaña's Future

Legacy giving is giving for the long-term. Gifts to Vista de la Montaña's Endowment Fund are pooled and invested to provide the church with the resources to grow and meet church needs into the long-term future. Vista's Endowment Fund is a permanent fund targeted to produce income to be used for current and future church purposes. When funds are available and distributed, they are used to support projects above and beyond normal budgeted items. The Endowment funds provide donors an opportunity to touch present and future ministries beyond their lifetime and leave a legacy of love that will always be remembered. It gives us the opportunity to ensure that Vista's future existence is guaranteed. Certain types of legacy gifts provide added benefits to the giver. Some gifts provide tax benefits, and can include such items as stocks, bonds, insurance policies, real estate or other assets. John Wesley said, "Gain all you can, Save all you can, Give all you can. Earning, saving, and giving are all means of giving oneself to God." Legacy giving to Vista's Endowment Fund is an option that each of us should consider. No gifts are too small.



Serve Vista from Your Home?!?

Have you perhaps been thinking "Gee, I'd like to help out at Vista but I'm not sure how or doing what"? We have just the thing, and you can do it *right in the comfort of your own home, on your own schedule!* It's the ministry we call "Vista's Shepherds".

A Vista Shepherd is a person who, several times a year, telephones a short list of Vista members (generally 6 to 8) who are unable to attend Vista in person or who may have special needs. Typical duration of such a call is a scant few minutes. A typical phone call usually goes something like "Hello; this is Jane/John Doe of Vista de la Montana's Shepherds Committee I'm just calling to see if you might have any concerns or any prayer requests you might like to bring to our attention." You would be surprised to hear how often the call recipient will respond positively. And that's it! If the person isn't home, we just leave a brief message.

Additionally, should a person on your list ask, they can request contacts more frequent than just a couple of times a year by calling their specific Shepherd or by calling Robin Conner (916-549-4939). Alternatively, the person can email <u>Admin@VistaUmc.org</u> or call the Church office (520-825-1985) to make such a request.

Last week prior to Sunday the 14th, I was privileged to receive a message from Bishop Juan Manuel Ruelas. He serves the Pacific district of the Methodist Church of Mexico. He asked if I would come down to Agua Prieta for the closing program of their annual Conference, to be held for the 1st time at our Sister Church Fuente de Vida. He wanted to show a token of their appreciation for our work across the last 20+ years in Agua Prieta. What an honor for me and our Vista Church.

There were many words of gratitude for all the clothes we collected for the conference. There were over 80 pastors, old and new, as well as 2 new Superintendents of 2 new districts that were anointed for their new tasks in the 3 states of Baja California, Sinaloa & Sonora. This bishop covers these 3 states in his work. Our sister pastor Gela Villicana was reassigned to her church in Agua Prieta. The women's Co-op prepared all the meals for the 5-day Conference and did a great job. The church floor has been improved by new tile work, a full platform from wall to wall and a lovely stone background wall behind the pulpit. A new roof, and five new donated Air Condition units were installed to keep the sanctuary cool and quite comfortable and once again usable. All this work was done in 1 month, working day & night to get it completed by June the 10th for the conference. Lots of singing and joy was overflowing in that building packed from wall to wall. Following the service that lasted over 3 hours we all went to the community room and had a delicious lunch. My, what a day we had! We then drove home in the oncoming storm that we could see ahead of us in the black sky. God was with us as we stayed just ahead of the storm and got home safely after a 2-hour slow crossing of the border.

I was honored to receive an inscribed plaque, but it is all of you who have been with us over the last 23 years, building the church and the community that share the honor! We have all made the education of young people possible so that they can have a prosperous future. As I stood to receive the plaque Pastor Gela asked all the students and graduates to stand and there they were all over the sanctuary, Teachers, Engineers, Business Owners, Lawyers etc. What a blessing!!
