

FELLOWSHIP FOCUS-JUNE 2025 MEET STEVE AND SHARON SCANLAN











When meeting Sharon Scanlan for the first time you may feel like you are being recharged and uplifted just by being near her. You enjoy the time you spend with her and look forward to your next meeting. Perhaps it crosses your mind that she could have invented the Energizer Bunny character; she certainly has been seen outpacing him throughout her lifetime!

Sharon was born in Mineral Point, WI; the third oldest town in that state and boasting of the title, "The Cornish Capitol of America". Her early years were influenced by her business minded, well-educated parents (both teachers) who were active in the local Methodist Church. It is noteworthy to mention Sharon's Cornish DNA was a factor that she became an 8th generation Methodist composed of Cornish miners, converted to Methodism by John Wesley. John was an English cleric, theologian, and evangelist who was a principal leader of a revival

movement within the Church of England known as Methodism. The societies he founded became the dominant form of the independent Methodist movement that continues to this day.

Sharon grew up in Lancaster, WI, where she attended grade school and high school. She moved on to attend college in Hamline, St. Paul, MN; a small Methodist school and transferred in her sophomore year to UW Madison, completing her time there with a B.S. degree in Textiles and Clothing Retail. The degree designation served her well as her first position as trainee with Sears in El Monte, CA. Moving to California brought years of sunshine, a vast difference with snow back in WI.

Steve Scanlan was born in Henderson, NV, where his dad was stationed during the war and the family moved back to Los Angeles when he was four. He grew up as a devout Catholic, from grade school through College with a degree in Political Science. Sharon's family tree allows her to claim being a Wisconsin Pioneer (1842) while Steve is an Arizona Pioneer (1900).

Both Steve and Sharon started in the Executive Training Program in 1970. 1973 brought Sharon a life-changing event. Steve and Sharon were department managers who opened a new Sears store in Laguna, Hills, Ca. Steve managed the Men's Department and Sharon's days were spent managing the Kid's Department. The couple began dating and got married in 1974. Three years after Sharon started working at Sears West Coast Headquarters in Alhambra, CA, she was asked to relocate to San Luis Obispo as store manager. While Sharon kept outclimbing her current positions up the corporate ladder, Steve left Sears and set out to build, remodel and supervise scores of projects which included duplexes/6-plexes, office buildings, two car washes, and spec houses. Moving to Phoenix in 1984 as Region Operations Manager opened the door for the move to Honolulu where Sharon became General Merchandise Manager followed by Region Manager. This position, despite the fact that the years that followed kept her career escalating to Vice President positions, meant the most to her. She officially became the first woman at Sears to hold this position; a feat displayed on the front page of the local newspaper, with the headline: "The Woman Who Runs Sears". That paper is proudly framed and displayed on a wall in the Scanlan's retirement home. More moves and high positions followed, including Seattle and Chicago. By the end of 32 years, the couple had moved 23 times, and Sharon had her fourth Vice President title (VP-Apparel Supply Chain). And Steve kept building......

In 2023, the Scanlans retired to Prescott, AZ. Sharon's lifetime of being a Methodist, immediately joined the Methodist Church there and eventually became their Finance Chair. She was active in the AAUW (American Association of United Women), the largest chapter in

Arizona and was on the Board of the Yavapai College Foundation. Eleven years later, after realizing Prescott provided more snow than they originally bargained for, they moved to SaddleBrooke, a retirement community North of Tucson. They began attending Vista de la Montaña United Methodist Church with "no intention in getting involved". At SaddleBrooke, Sharon manages the DesertView Library including "recruiting" SaddleBrooke residents to Vista UMC. She enjoys genealogy and card making. Steve catalogs all books at DesertView with the exception of non-fiction ones. He is one of the original Senior Village group of volunteers. At Vista UMC, Sharon has held the position of Finance Chair since 2015, writes current Vista articles for both SaddleBrooke and Ranch papers, started a Zoom Lectionary Bible Study, now with 10 active members for the last six years, Sunday usher, greeter, liturgist, communion server, office receptionist volunteer, and has preached three times as she enjoys public speaking. She was in the initial planning process for Vista's library room, a project proudly used for small meetings and a place to relax and read. Back home in SaddleBrooke, Steve does the cooking, because he doesn't like hers!

Since 2004, the Scanlans have enjoyed traveling; Sharon has claimed 68 countries and Steve has visited 64. Two of their vacations have been five weeks long. Sharon got a head start in 1996 when she had completed visiting all 50 states.

Sharon and Steve's marriage has included two children from Steve's previous marriage. Karen (who lived with them for two years), is a single mother, now living in Cypress, TX, teaches 3rd grade and has two boys in college. Son Chris, and his wife Jennifer, live in Redondo Beach, CA with two teenagers in high school and is the head of sales for a Network Security Company.
