



## FELLOWSHIP FOCUS - Pete Rice







This narrative outlines the life journey of Pete Rice, a study in human resilience and adaptability in the face of significant life challenges, primarily stemming from a diagnosis of Cerebral Palsy (CP) at an early age.

Pete was born in Stanford, CT, on March 19, 1940 and three years later his sister, Virginia, completed the Rice family. At age three, he received his CP diagnosis. Guided by a supportive family environment, his mother proactively sought specialized treatment in Douglaston, Queens, New York, leading the family to relocate there. Treatments included wearing a brace on his right foot. The family eventually settled in Glen Cove, Long Island, New York, where Pete completed his formative education.

Pete attended school in Douglaston until the end of the third grade when the family moved to Glen Cove, Long Island, NY, where Pete lived through high school in 1958.

Pete's childhood offered a series of seasonal nostalgic memories from early years spent in Glen Cove. He recalls summers filled with sports, adventures with friends, and outdoor activities like swimming and fishing. Winter memories include sledding and ice skating. Family life was also a central theme, with Pete's dad's building projects around the house and their mom's small playschool run from the basement. Those impressionable years include connections to notable baseball players who lived in the area (Whitey Ford and Roy Campanella). Baseball was a big part of his youth as he played on the Rotary Club, Queens Men's Shop, and Miller Homes Little League teams. His teenage years also included socializing and dance parties with friends.

Pete pursued higher education at the New York Institute of Technology, earning a degree in Applied Science focused on Radio and TV Production. His professional life showcased a versatile approach to employment, often holding multiple positions simultaneously:

- **Primary Career:** Secured a position as a Watchman at the Courthouse in Mineola, Long Island. His consistent 12 midnight to 8 am shift allowed for diverse supplementary employment.
- **Early Roles:** Worked in photo engraving (Powers Chamco) and various day jobs (Haines Underwear, Merrill Lynch, Abilities Incorporated, known for hiring disabled workers, hired him as a receiving clerk.
- **Civil Service:** In 1972, he passed the Civil Service test and transitioned to a 40-year career as a Computer Operator I in Rockville Centre, Long Island, a role he held until his 2004 retirement.

In 1973, Pete purchased his own home in Freeport, Long Island. His personal life evolved with marriage to Lorainne on October 12, 1976. They welcomed a son, Shawn, a year later. (Shawn now lives in Vermont, with his wife, Suzy and their three sons: Jack, 16, Eric, 12, and Luke, 7.

Upon retirement in 2004, Pete and Lorainne relocated to the SaddleBrooke community near Tucson, Arizona, drawn by the climate and lifestyle opportunities of the Southwest.

God had a plan for Pete and Lorainne for a church. Pete, a life long Christian, was raised as a Christian Scientist and had attended several denominations: in addition to Christian Scientist, he attended Unity Congregational Church in Rockville Centre before they retired.

Pete, after an invitation from Vista UMC member as well as his neighbor, Don Little, quickly integrated into the local community at Vista UMC in Catalina, Arizona. He engaged actively in church activities, including:

- United Methodist Men projects (rummage sales, highway cleanup).
- Serving as the "Children's Shepherd" and a greeter.
- Documenting church life through photography.

Pete experienced a profound personal loss when his first partner, Lorainne, passed away in 2011. He later found connection through "Seniors for Seniors" online dating, where he met Karen, an auditor for AZ State, during a lunch date. Pete and Karen married in 2013 and shared a decade together before Karen sadly passed away in 2023. Karen is survived by her son, Karl, and his wife, Louise, along with their two grandchildren who live in England: Clayton (14) and Hollie (10).

This story would not be complete without going back to the opening sentence about Pete's 'life challenges". After Karen passed away, Pete continued living in their SaddleBrooke home. After a fall at home, he remained on the floor for four days, unable to reach help until a concerned friend from church located him. The result was for him to move to an Assisted Living facility. While recovering in assisted living, he broke his leg again during exercise.

When asked how he navigated the extreme isolation during his four-day entrapment, Pete attributed his survival to his faith, continuously reciting "The Lord's Prayer, the 23rd Psalm, and the "Unity Prayer of Protection," illustrating a profound reliance on spiritual grounding throughout his life's challenges.

Despite relying on a wheelchair currently, he remains determined to maintain his independence and community connections, utilizing the Sun Shuttle to attend church services.
